Coming to Stouffville

A mobile sports encyclopedia

STOUFFVILLE - Appropriately christened a 'sports encyclopedia on wheels', a huge 40 foot van containing two individual mobile units, will 'set up shop' in Stouffville, for a period extending from Nov. 22 to 25.

Sports '71 is a project sponsored by the Department of National Health and Welfare and geared to encourage and develop athletic leadership and organization in

communities such as Whitchurch-Stouffville and areas beyond the central core.

The range of influence can extend for a radius of 15 miles, taking in places like Markham, Brougham, Clarendon, Goodwood, Vivian, Gormley and Unionville.

While residents will be encouraged to visit the 'parent' van, the two mobile units with capable personnel on board, will be conducting visitations on their own. The programming of these visits will be established well in advance by a committee already organized. The chairman is Wilfred Morley of Stouffville.

Other members are - Lorne Boadway, Dave Connell, Ed Grimshaw, Jim Rehill and Jim Thomas of Stouffville; Mrs. Lee Wong, Vivian; Len Henderson, Ron Jones and Ken Hulse of Markham; Bob Woodcock and Betty vanNostrand of Vondorf; Cliff Dunkeld and Dave MacDonald, Clarendon and Ron Smith of Ballantrae.

A second meeting was held Oct. 27.

The Caravan will cross through Ontario and Quebec, stopping in communities like Stouffville, along the way. No fee is charged. The project is subsidized by the Prudential Insurance Company of America.
