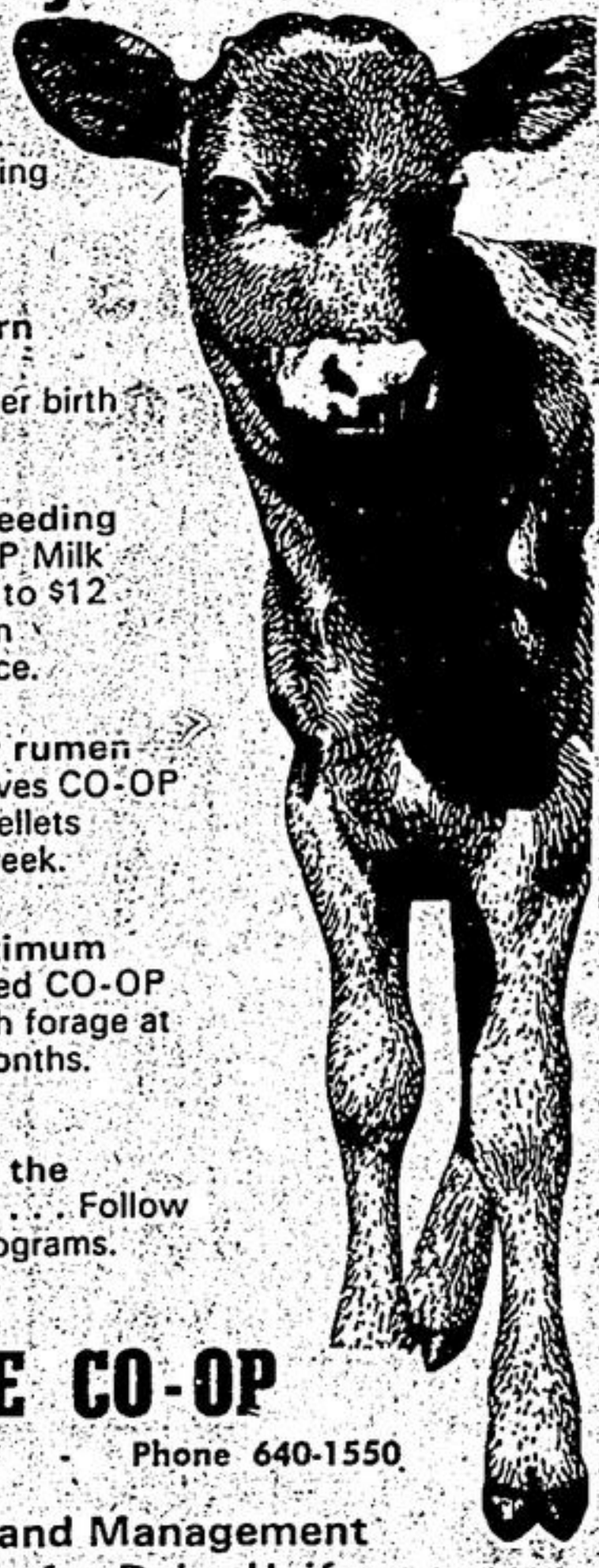

Dead before crash

GORMLEY - An 87 year old driver, involved in a head-on crash Oct. 7, on Don Mills Road, north of Gormley, was dead prior to impact, an autopsy report revealed this week.

Fletcher Fulthorp, of Richmond Hill had suffered a heart attack, causing his auto to veer across the highway and into the northbound lane. Killed in the collision was Mrs. Sylvia Kleinsteuber, 28, mother of two, of Aurora.

Mrs. Mary Fulthorp, a passenger in her husband's car, was injured but has since been released from York County Hospital, Newmarket.

Coroner Dr. Blair Mitchell of Stouffville attended the accident scene. No inquest will be held.
