STOUFFVILLE - Recent weeks have proved rewarding to cross-country teams at Stouffville Dist. Secondary School.

In competition at the Eaton Estate near King City, both girls and boys participated in the York County Championships. The junior girls finished 2nd; the senior girls 3rd; the junior boys, 2nd; the intermediate boys, 1st and the senior boys, 3rd. As a result of this combined effort, Stouffville came home with the County Title.

On Saturday, the Stouffville teams were entered in the Georgian Bay Championships. The junior girls, with Mary Bolton, Dale Grose, Susan Storry and Colleen Clarke, finished 9th.
