This program was planned to correct the low voltage conditions which have occurred in past winter months. The conversion is now complete.

Criticize leaf-burning laws

STOUFFVILLE At a recent meeting, Council discussed a burning issue: leaves. Mayor Ken Laushway introduced the matter, observing that it might be acceptable to burn small amounts, but large fires produced smoke, ash, and general pollution. He described provincial legislation which bars this method of disposal, and said he felt the municipality should help out. The Works Department, he said,

could remove any leaves left out in proper containers. Councillor June Button took issue with the anti-burning legislation, terming it "silly". "A lot of the trees are on Town property", she said, "People have called me up asking when the Town is going to remove its leaves". "The leaves are on ratepayers' property", pointed out Mayor Laushway. Councillor Merlyn

Baker also attacked the legislation. "I can't understand why the Department wants to take away the pleasure of the smell of burning leaves", he said. Encouraged by this support, Councillor Button returned to the attack. "The inspector from the Department admitted this is a silly law", she claimed. "I'm not sure our Works Department could handle the problem. One lady

phoned me and said she had 45 bags of leaves—that's a lot of leaves. It's a stupid law". Councillor Baker suggested that compost heaps would solve the problem. After considerable discussion, Council voted to give the Works Department authority to pick up leaves in the former Village area, and to hire extra trucks if necessary. Pickups are scheduled for November 8.
