Brief is 'carved' by Council

GOODWOOD - A brief on regional government, prepared by Township councillor Frank Hendy, underwent drastic changes Nov. 1.

After two hours of discussion, Mr. Hendy was left with five of his original 22 recommendations.

Much of the review centered around matters of terminology and jurisdiction. There was some doubt as to how wide-ranging the brief should be. At one point Deputy Reeve Don Jackson questioned a clause suggesting a borough-type system in the southern part of Ontario County.

"I don't think we should comment on reorganization in the south", he said.

"There's nothing wrong with the power of suggestion", maintained Reeve Bob Nesbitt. The clause was left in.

Some sections of the report met with no opposition. An attack on "antiquated provincial laws", support for the Toronto-Centered Region Plan, and several other clauses met with general approval.

Other suggestions were received with unanimous disagreement. A suggested amalgamation between the Township and the Town of Uxbridge was discarded. Several recom-

mendations were removed because they dealt with such matters as waste disposal, education, and other subjects not directly related to the main body of the brief.

On the subject of increased provincial grants to municipalities, councillor Clark Muirhead grew eloquent.

"Give us the money", he said, paraphrasing Sir

Winston Churchill, "and we will finish the job".

A suggestion by councillor Darcy Higgins that municipalities use their own initiative in forming joint projects, was well received.

A revised copy, taking note of deletions and additions, will be submitted. When finalized, it will be sent to Ontario's Minister of Municipal Affairs, Hon. Dalton Bales.

Ask telephone rate increase

STOUFFVILLE - Within the last three weeks, Stouffville residents have been hit by three anticipated increases in local service rates.

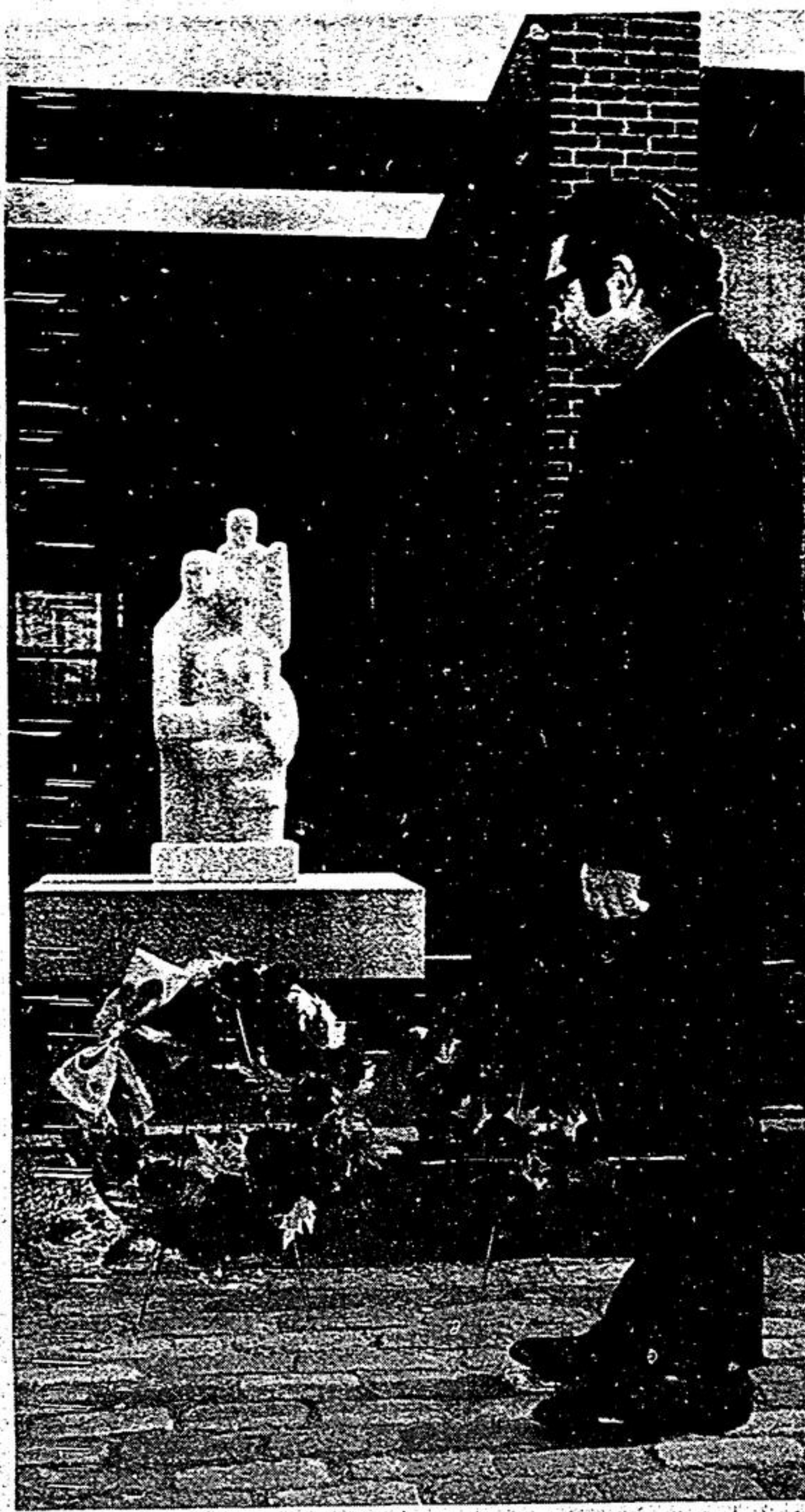
First, it was water; then hydro, and now telephone. The latter application will soon go before the Canadian Transport Commission.

If approved, Stouffville telephone subscribers will not be as hard-hit as those in some other communities. Here, the proposed increase is from \$4.55 to \$5 (monthly), for individual residential phones; \$3.60 to \$3.96

for 2-party lines and a 30 cent increase for those on a multi-party line.

Bell is asking an interim increase, to take effect Jan. 1. This would amount to five cents a month in Stouffville. The balance would be applied when approved by the Commission.

Bell manager, Gordon B. Wansbrough related the requested increases to a growing demand for improved service. One of these areas is Ballantrae, where many new homes have been erected recently. A sharp rise in capital costs is also a major factor, Mr. Wansbrough said.

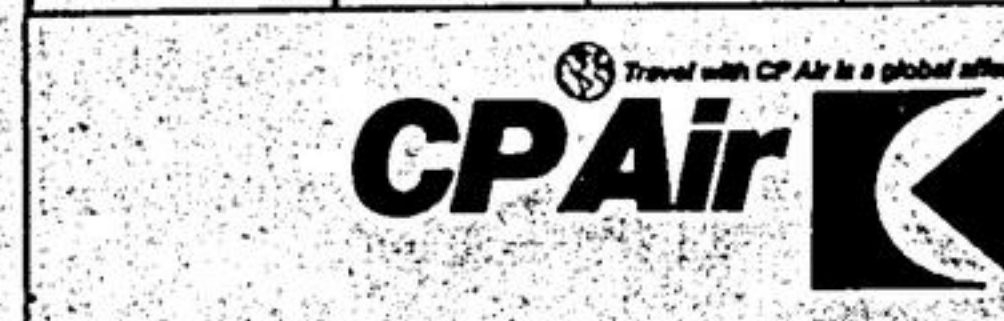

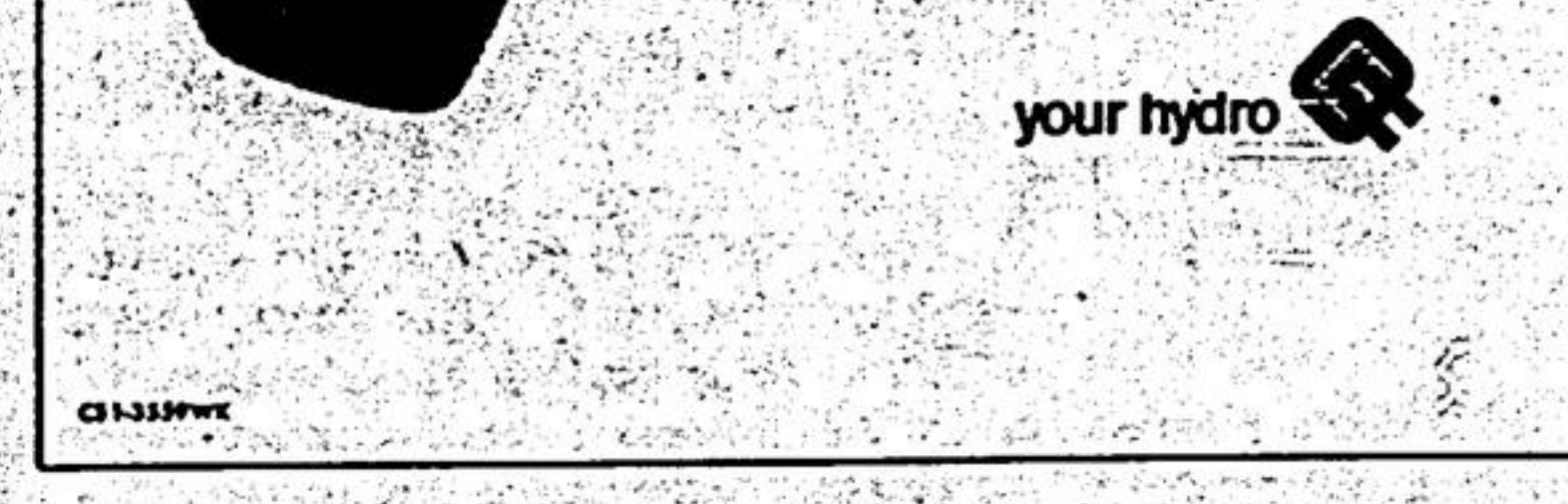
The funeral service will be conducted from the McEachnie Funeral Home on Thursday at 2 p.m. with interment in Claremont Cemetery.
