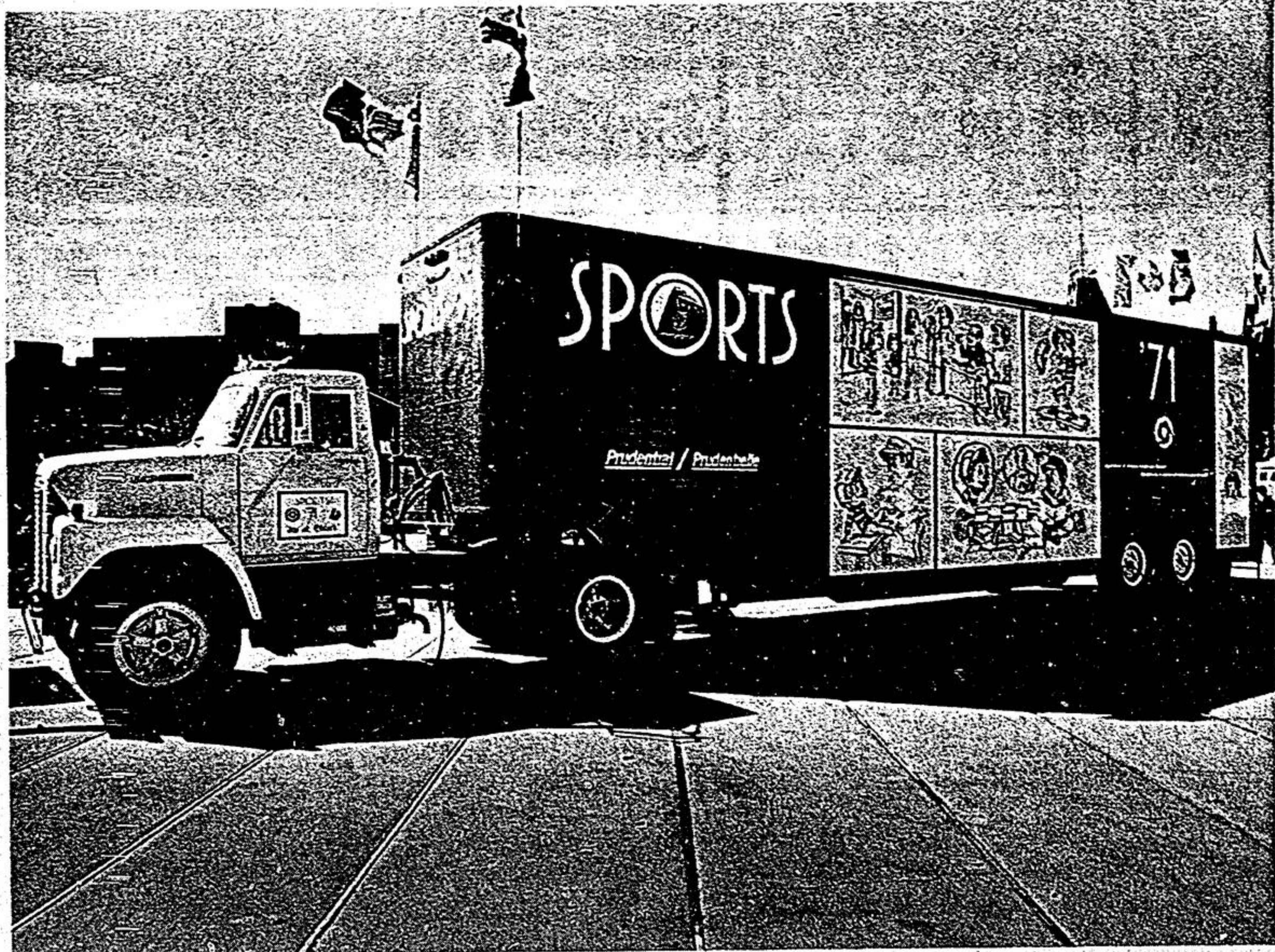
Shut-out night

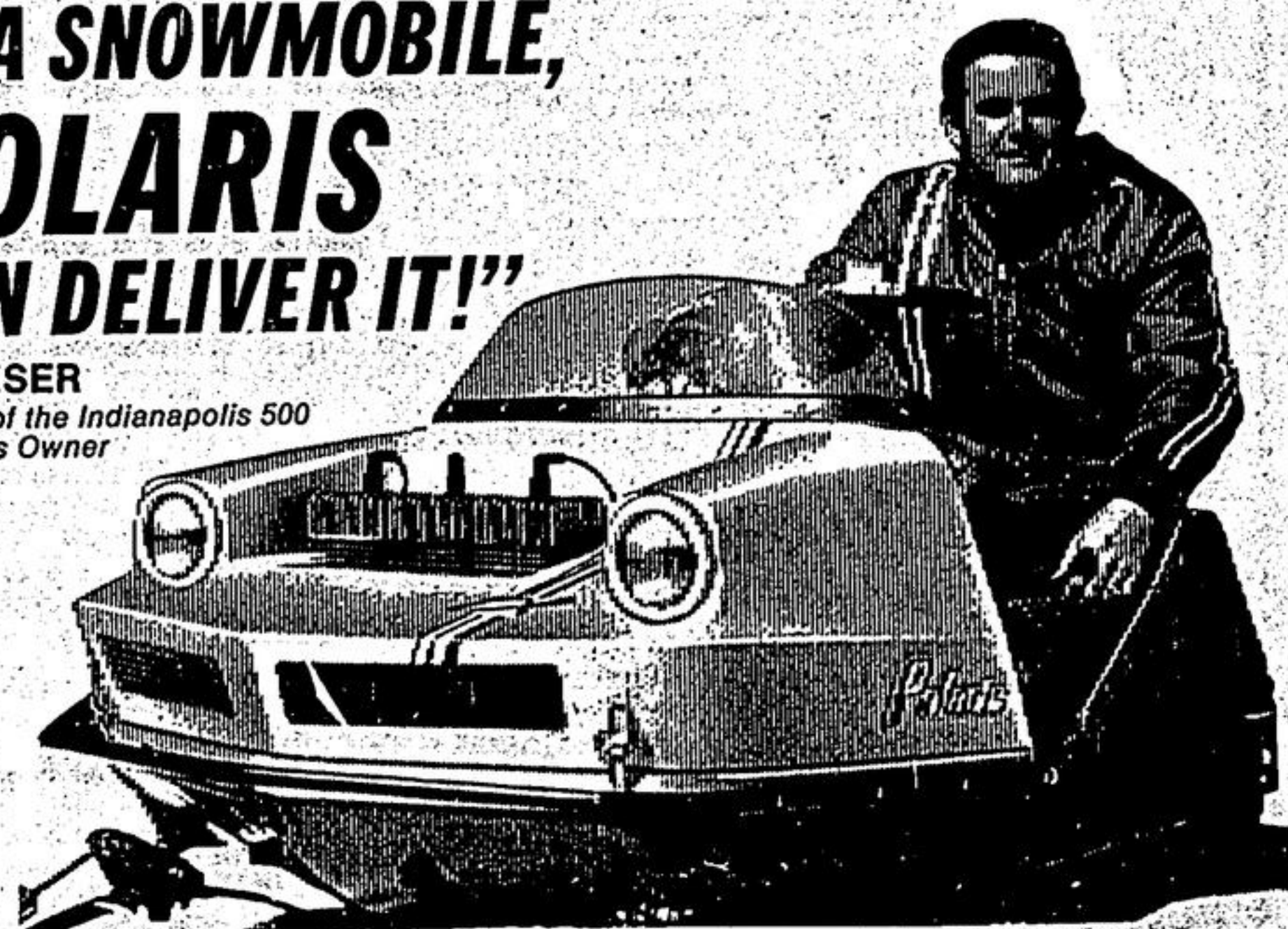
