Snowmobile bylaw

'Later than we think' - Mayor

STOUFFVILLE - Although the year's first snow has fallen, Council is no closer to passing the proposed snowmobile bylaw. Two letters were read at the Nov. 12 meeting, both of them urging restrictions on snowmobiles. One writer, a resident of

Church Street, described that road as having been "a racetrack" last winter. These letters, and others both supporting and opposing the bylaw, will be investigated by the Bylaw Committee. When the proposed snowmobile legislation


came up for second reading, Councillor Merlyn Baker moved that second reading be deferred until Council's next meeting. He said there would be a meeting shortly with the Snowmobile Association, and he hoped to bring back some proposed amendments to the

bylaw. Mr. Baker's motion was approved, but Mayor Ken Laushway said he hoped the bylaw could be passed at the next meeting. "It's getting late in the season", he said, "we should get this enacted before much more time goes by".
