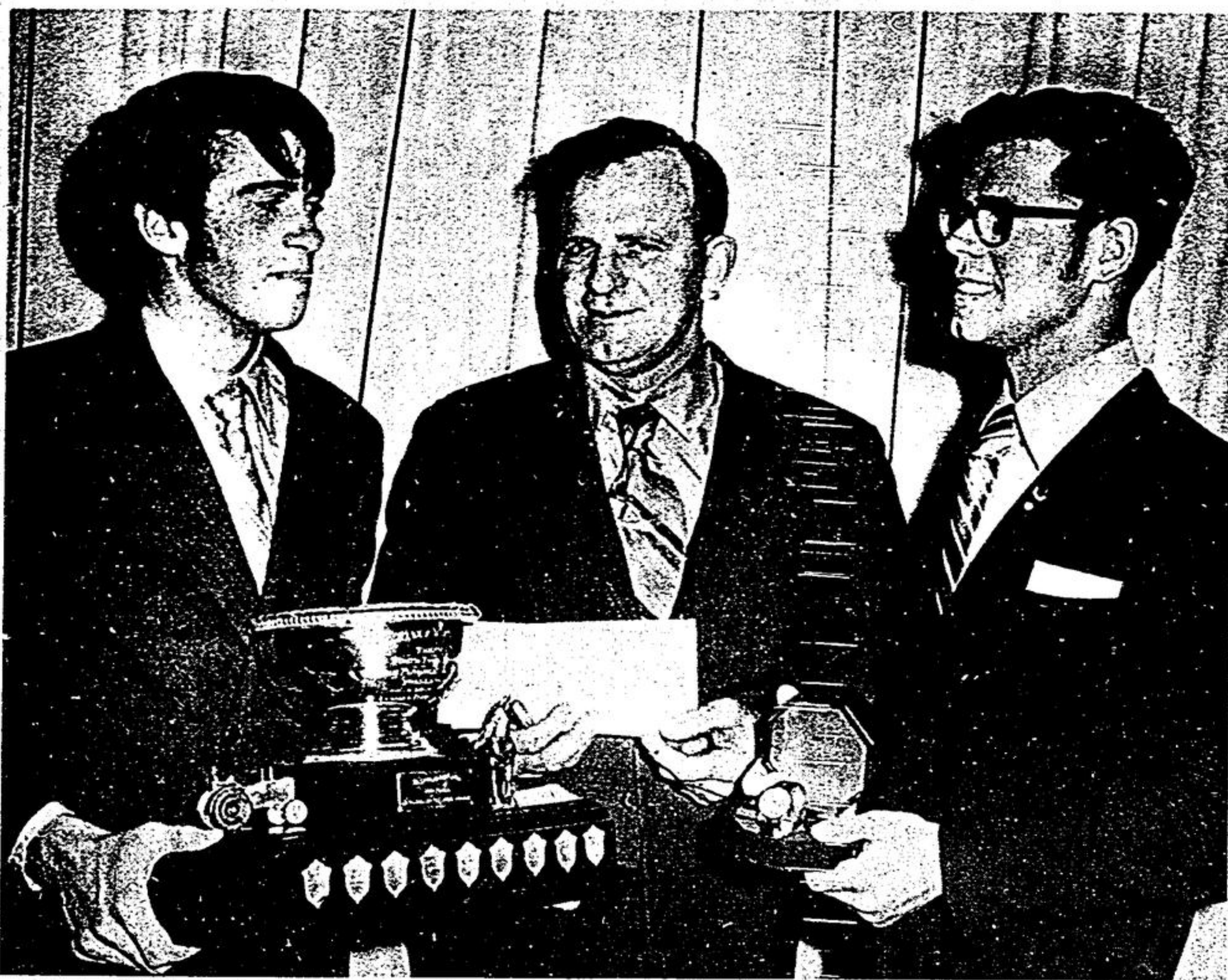


Growing!

STOUFFVILLE - The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville is still growing. This was indicated through figures released recently by Council. Building Inspector Marshall Miller reported he has issued a total of 304 building permits so far this year. These include 125 for houses, 51 for apartment units and 1 for an industrial building. Total value of the construction was over \$4,300,000.

UNIONVILLE - New construction will begin soon in Unionville. Installation of ten-inch sanitary sewers was discussed at Markham Council, Nov. 23. Streets affected include Eureka, Union, Euclid, Kennedy Road and Hwy. 7. Council members voted unanimously to approve the project. No date for commencement of this work has yet been announced.

Plan Claremont school addition

CLAREMONT - A large addition is in the planning stage for Claremont Public School.

The school presently has an enrolment of 320, and one portable is in use. According to Principal Alban Ward, there have been problems in grouping students by grades, since the enrolment is heaviest in the senior divisions.

"This tends to make our programs inflexible", he explained.

The new part will include a 2,000 square foot auditorium-gymnasium, three classrooms, a library, and an office. At the same time, the older part of the school will be renovated. This will be done in a manner which will allow further expansion if Claremont should become a central school in the area.

While tenders have not yet been called by the County Board of Education, Mr. Ward is confident all work will be completed by September 1972.

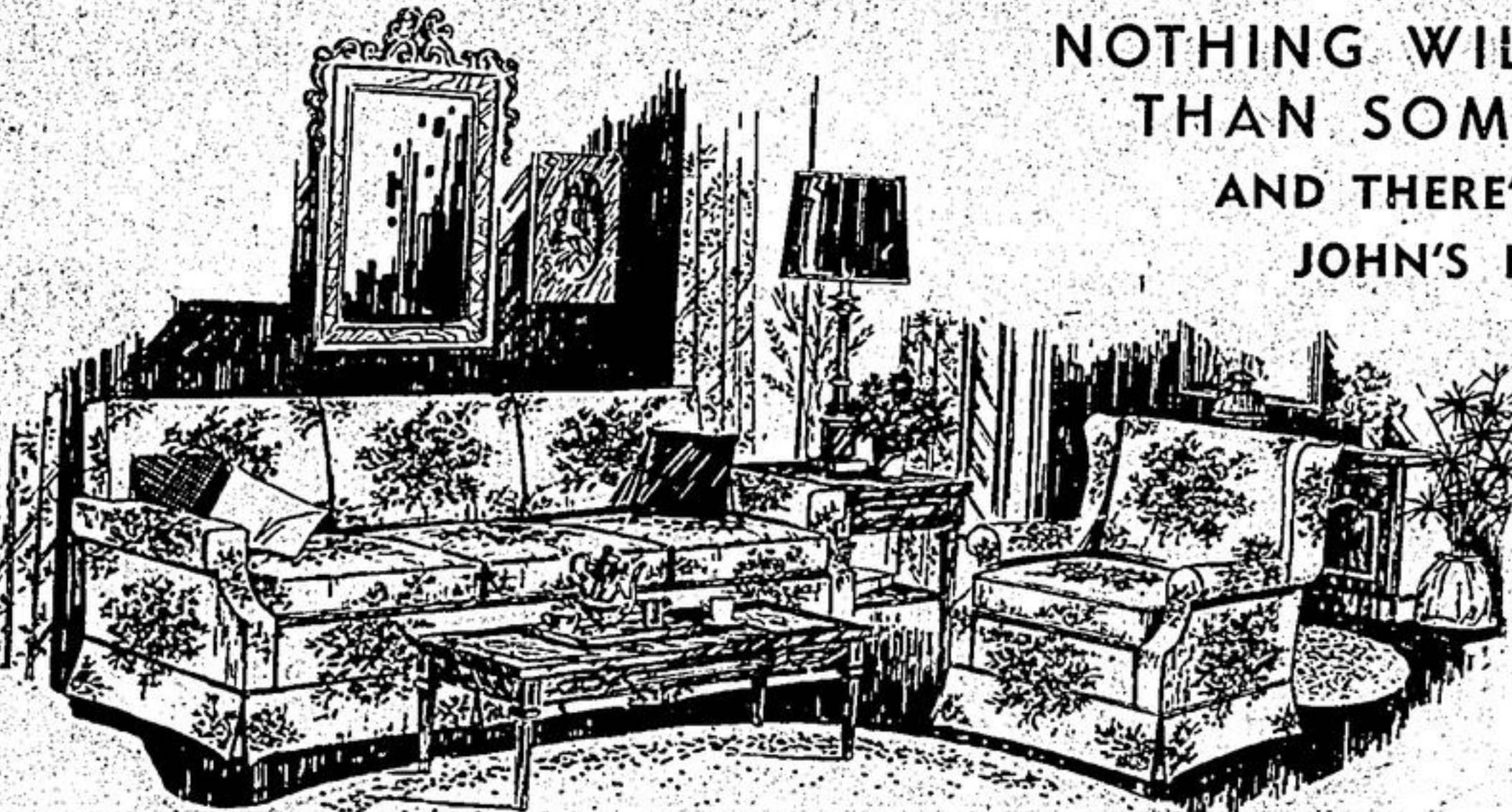

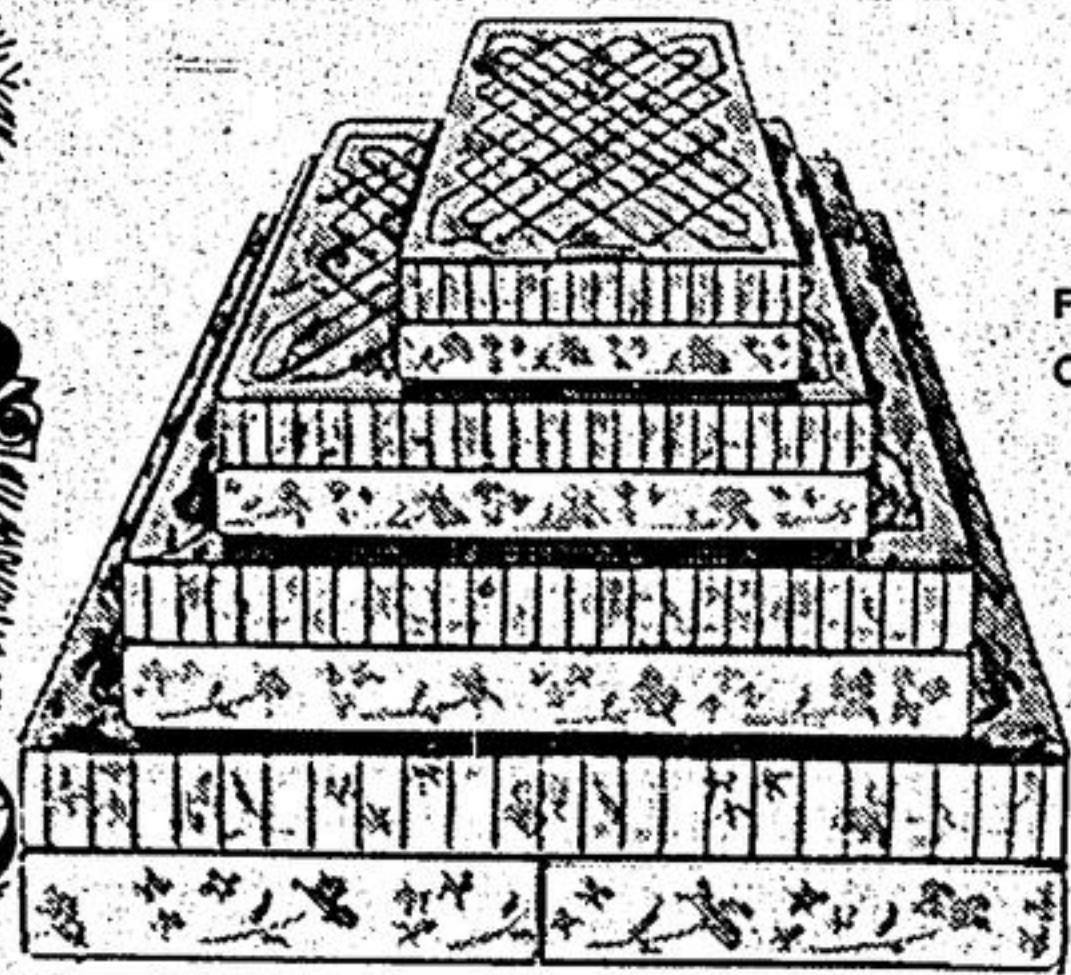

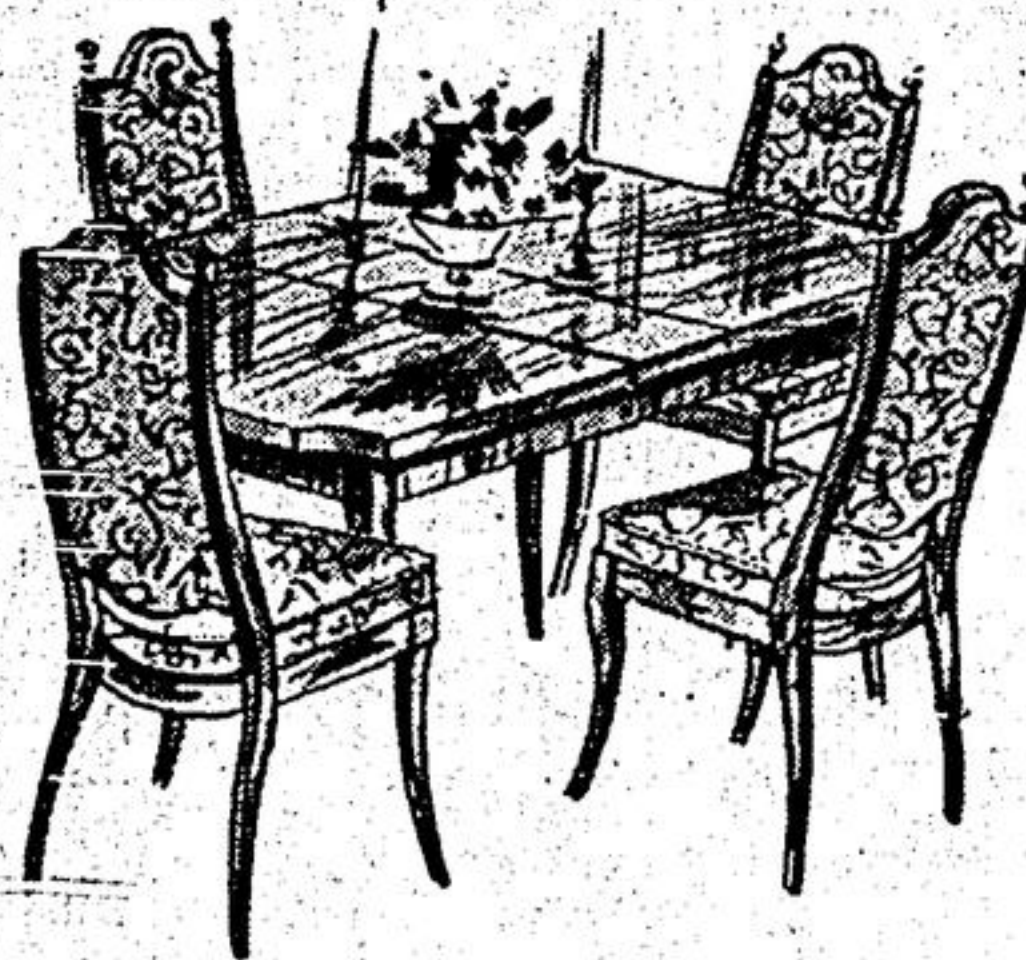
