Commission members. Speaking to the resolution, Aurora Mayor Dick Illingworth said he felt the police had done a generally good job. Mr. Twinnedy explained that the matter of a Youth Bureau is being looked into by the Commission. "We haven't got the money at present," he said. He stated that he had enjoyed sitting on the Commission in the past, and his sentiment was echoed by Councillor Harold Lawrie.

Councillor Gordon Rowe felt the police have some good programs, and singled out a school safety team for praise. Mayor Ken Laushway said that many people expect too much for a force in its first year of operation.

Police Force garners praise and criticism at Region

YORK REGION - The police came in for some praise - and a few knocks - at a Regional Council meeting Dec. 9.

A resolution was brought forward to nominate Councillors Ray Twinnedy and Harold Lawrie as the Region's Police Commission representatives until Dec. 31, 1972. Mr. Lawrie and Mr. Twinnedy are presently

tempting to supply jobs for unemployed young people with high school education or more, and at the same time help community agencies and improve their services. Some areas where jobs will be available are day nurseries, homes for the aged and family service agencies.

Anyone between the ages of 18 and 25, who has a minimum of high school graduation can apply. Applications should be sent to Project 500, Ontario Department of Social and Family Services, 6th Floor, Hepburn Building, Queen's Park, Toronto.

Project 500 is at

Stouffville. People in this area, and in similar communities across Ontario, have not readily responded to 'Project 500'.

This program, supported by the Department of Social and Family Services, aims at providing jobs during the winter months. The Minister, Hon. Thomas Wells, notes that response from Metro Toronto has been good but adds, "I am very concerned about the small number of applications we've received from other areas of Ontario."
