Three local skaters win honors

STOUFFVILLE Local skaters have brought considerable acclaim home to Stouffville with them. Three area youngsters competed in the recent Central Ontario Figure Skating Championships, widely considered to be the toughest in Canada. Peter Mellon, 12, of Tindale Ave., turned in the most outstanding performance. Peter, who has only been skating for 3 years, placed third in the Novice Men's division. This was the first time he had entered the competition, and he was pitted against a

large field of entrants. Jane Brodie, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Doug Brodie, Glad Park Ave., placed fourth in the Novice Ladies competition. Another local girl, Nancy Yakeley of R.R.1, Goodwood, placed fourth in the semi-finals, narrowly missing the finals. Frank Mellon, president of the Stouffville Figure Skating Club, said he was "very proud" of his son, Peter's performance. Much of the credit, he observed is due to the instructors who work with the youngsters.
