# Order four Juvenile team players suspended

**STOUFFVILLE**  
Four members of the **Stouffville Juvenile hockey team** were suspended, three for a single game and one indefinitely, following a brawl, Saturday, in the Sunderland Arena, described by one eyewitness as "the worst I've ever seen".  
Sidelined for a single contest were Ken Harman, Frank Roberts and Wayne Emerson. Out of action pending a hearing before the O.M.H.A. is Don Norton.  
Names of suspended Sunderland players, if any, were not released.  
What started it all, depends on who you talk to, but neutral observers called it "a disgrace".  
Coach Harold Hodgson said the trouble erupted when a couple of Sunderland spectators "invaded" the penalty box. Officials attempted to separate the combatants and other players joined in. When the situation threatened to develop into a wholesale free-for-all, the rink lights were turned out.
