went to his place and couldn't find him, answered Mr. Baker claimed that the man in question had found it. "Maybe those have been corrected by now," suggested the Mayor.

"Maybe they have," he suggested that the Waste Management officials be asked to take regular samples from the test wells, to insure that such defects don't recur.

Mayor Laushway concluded discussion by saying he was trying to arrange a meeting with Waste Management officials "early in January".

He suggested the possibility of a further inspection, and seeking help from the Department.

Councillor Gordon Ratcliff cited reports from the O.W.R.C. received earlier this year, which listed certain shortcomings at the Bremner Dump.

They didn't you Council members when you visited the site?" Mr. Br. asked the Mayor.

"I still want councils to visit the site," said the Mayor, reminding him that he had specifically promised to arrange an inspection.
