Balsam couple mark diamond anniversary

BALSAM - On Jan. 3, 1912, Winton White and Lila Barclay were married at the Barclay homestead, conc. 7 and the Brock Road, Pickering Township. That was sixty years ago.

On Sunday, Winton and Lila White celebrated their Diamond Wedding anniversary, receiving close friends and family relatives at their lovely home in Balsam.

Winton White was born July 24, 1888, one of three in the family of John and Mary White. He attended public school at Mt. Pleasant and Brougham.

Lila was an only child of John and Sarah Barclay. She also attended Mt. Pleasant Public School.

Mr. White, extremely active for his 83 years, recalls their wedding day well. There was very little snow on the ground, so he and his bride travelled by horse and buggy to Clarendon where they boarded the train for Toronto. Winton drove the horse himself but someone else in the party brought the rig back.

On their return, the couple farmed at Brougham and later at Clarendon, now the Nursing Home, west of the village. They built their new home near Balsam, five years ago, following the sale of their farm to Bill Newman, well-known M.P.P., Ontario South. Mr. White retained considerable land,

In his younger days, he was the winner of many awards with cattle at the Royal, the C.N.E. and country fairs.

He was also an exceptionally fine football player, performing at full-back with the famed Green River 'Shamrocks'. A

team picture hangs on the wall of his study. Only two other members of the team survive, his brother, Charlie and Blake Annis, now of Markham.

Mr. and Mrs. White have two sons, John and Donald, and two

daughters, Mrs. Mary Price, Toronto and Mrs. Virginia Grey, Pine Orchard. They have 9 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren.

On their anniversary occasion, Mr. Newman attended in person to present them with an

engraved plaque, a gift from Ontario Premier Bill Davis. A telegram of congratulations was also received from Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau with a second anticipated from the Queen.

NOTICE

By-law 1517 is the Restricted Area or Zoning By-law of the Corporation of the Township of Uxbridge ("Township") and affects all lands and landowners in the said Township. The Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) granted approval to By-law 1517 in the main on the 24th of March, 1970, but granted only temporary approval to those portions of the By-law that are referred to in the accompanying Appointment for Hearing. This temporary approval was extended by the subsequent Order of the OMB dated the 13th of April, 1971, which has since expired. The Township then applied to the OMB for a further extension of the temporary approval pursuant to the provisions of The Planning Act of Ontario. As a result, the OMB has appointed the 20th of January, 1972, at the time and place as set out in the said accompanying Appointment for Hearing to hear this application and to hear all interested parties attending thereat.

In the meantime, the OMB made an Interim Order dated the 18th of October, 1971, extending the temporary approval until the 23th of January, 1972.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that this application is separate from the application of the Township to the OMB for its approval of By-laws 1585 and 1589 of the Township which amend By-law 1517 and it is not in alteration thereof but is in addition thereto.
