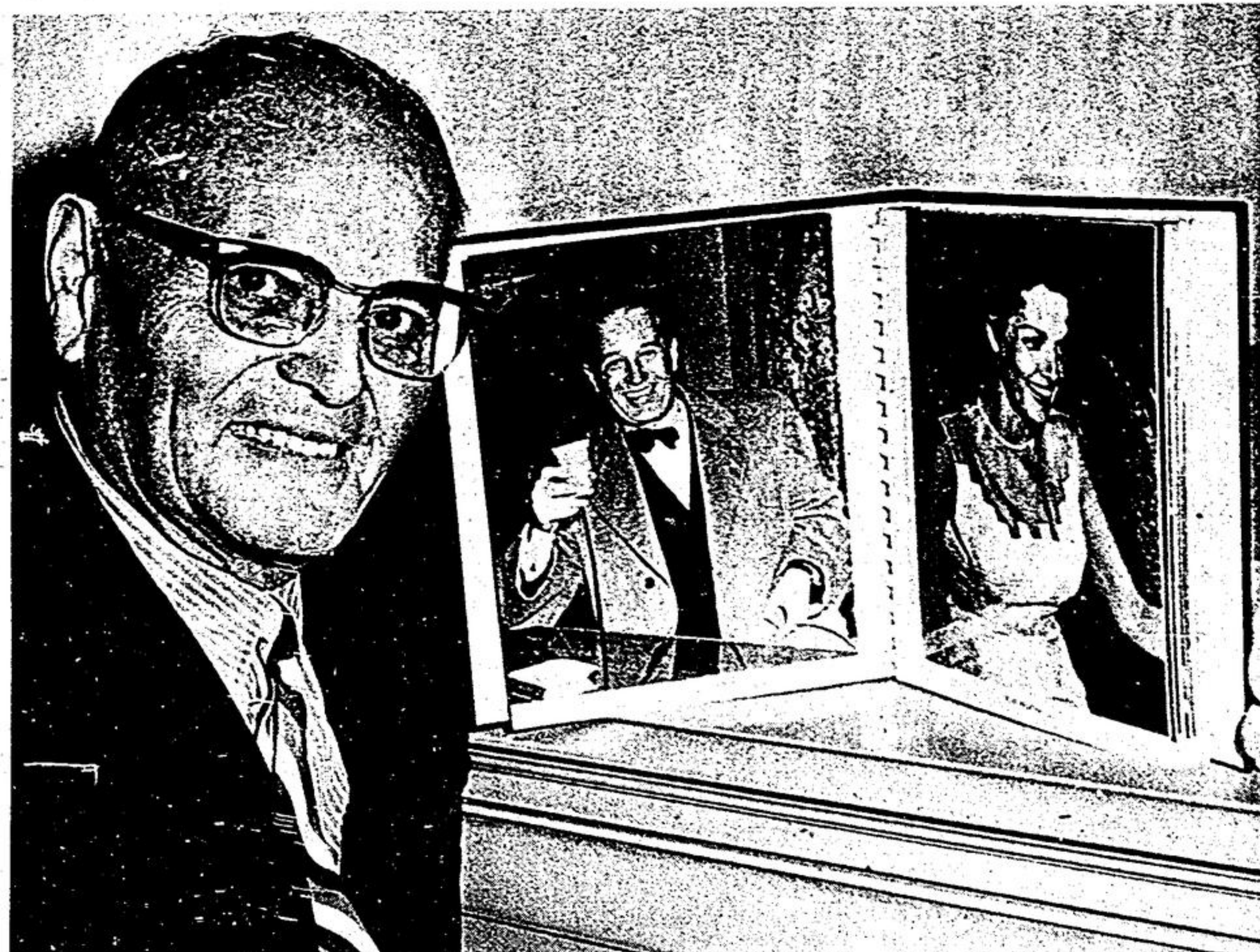

Shared company with Hollywood stars

STOUFFVILLE - In the front hallway of Bob Ellis' Loretta Crescent home, hangs a huge framed portrait of movie star, Jill St. John.

It's a beautiful picture of a beautiful girl. But to Bob Ellis, it's much more than that. It's part of his life, an exciting chapter treasured from the days when he operated the Carleton-Yonge Photo Limited studio in downtown Toronto.

But while capturing candid shots of actors

and actresses, took only a small portion of his time, it was undoubtedly, the most interesting part of his work.

Bob Ellis, now retired, travelled widely - Italy, France and Hollywood, California. His photo albums, that turn the past into the present, could be treasured within the archives of 20th Century Fox.

The list seems endless - Richard Egan, Jane Russel, Gracie Fields, Jimmy Stewart, Trevor Howard, Rod Steiger, Gregory Peck, Danny Kaye, Elvis Presley, John Wayne, Bob Hope, Carey Grant, Jayne Mansfield, Maurice Chevalier and his favorite, Ginger Rogers.

Due to the proximity of his Studio to the big-name theatres in Toronto, Bob Ellis was continually called on, by them for publicity picture assignments. Being fluent in both German and French, as well as English, gave him an advantage over others, including the news

media. Few of the Ellis photos were posed, in fact almost all were candid and with one click of the shutter. Hence his nickname - 'One-shot Ellis'.

Museum program

Church histories

MARKHAM - A paper on the early churches in the former Twp. of Markham, with references to their history, will be presented before a public meeting in the Museum, (Mt. Joy Public School), Monday, Jan. 17 at 8 p.m., by Mr. Ewart J. Stiver of Unionville.

In this regard, Markham has a rich heritage.

The Germans, of the Bercezy Settlement, brought their Lutheran pastor with them in 1794. The Mennonites arrived in numbers, just after the turn of the century, from Switzerland and the United States. They were followed by branches of the Methodist movement in the Markham, Victoria Square and Unionville localities.

The Presbyterians established congregations at Melville, Unionville, Markham and Brown's Corners.

Soon afterwards, the First Baptist congregation was established on the Ninth Line of Markham, about 1837.

Mr. Stiver is well-known in the area, being actively interested in Sunday School and church work for over 50 years.
