The cement floor was poured last week. Interior plastering, the windows and stage are still to be done.

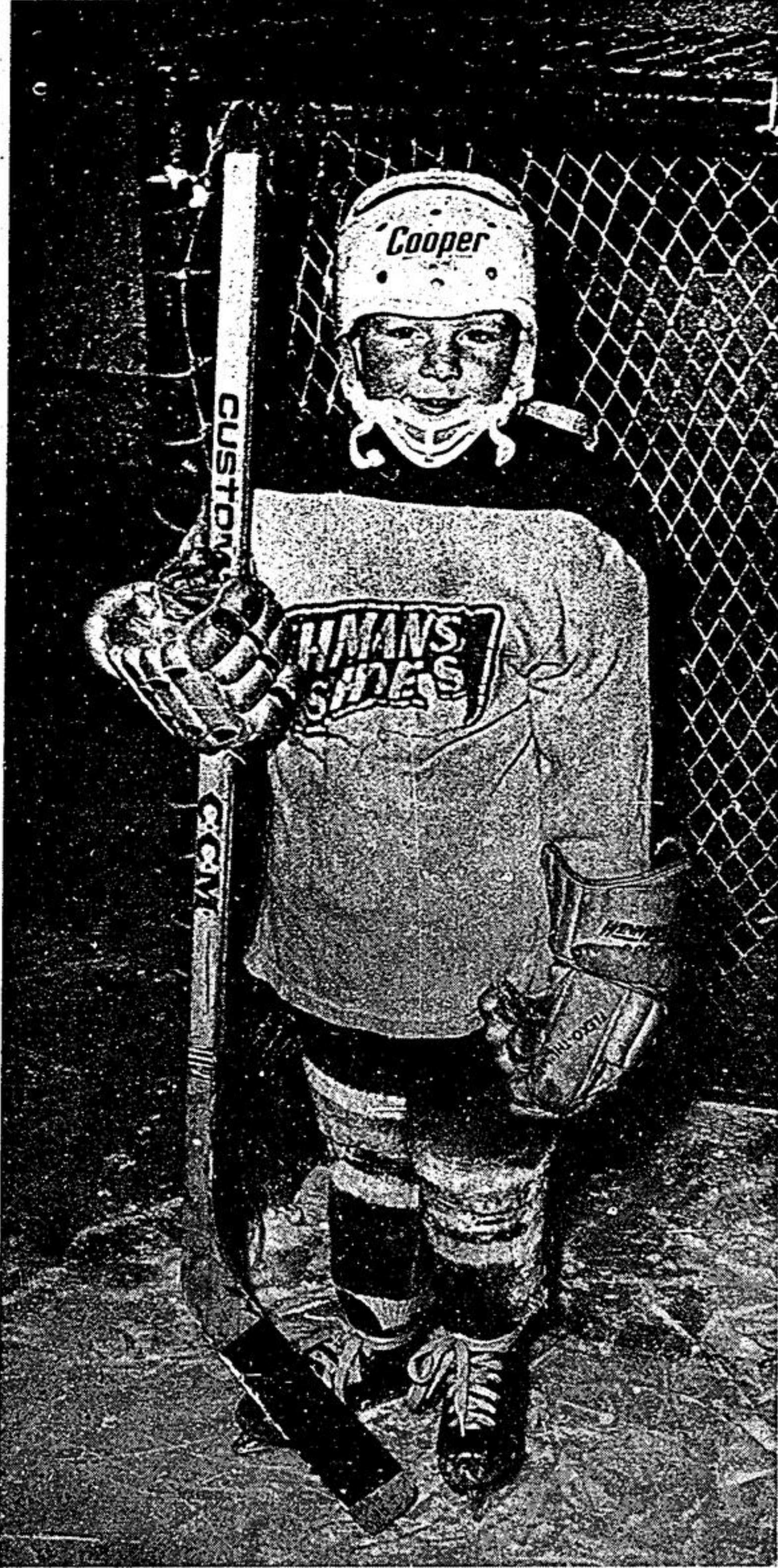
Two teams tie

STOUFFVILLE - Ed Grimshaw, local convenor in the Stouffville Minor Hockey Association and a member on the Stouffville Community Centre Board, has taken on yet another

position of responsibility. He's the new Chairman of the Whitechurch-Stouffville Recreation Committee, succeeding Bill Paine of Vandorf.

The first meeting of 1972 was held in the Community Hall at Vandorf, Jan. 18. In attendance were - Bill Paine, vice-chairman; Mrs. Ruth Warden, secretary-treasurer; councillor Betty vanNostrand, Mrs. Joan Doble, Wilfrid Morley and Jim Thomas.

With directors, Linda Johnson and Colin Hollidge in attendance, the program offered at Slater's Pool, Vandorf, was discussed at length. The staff includes five instructors and two helpers with classes for all ages. A Wednesday evening course is offered to adults with a 'crash course' planned for the mid-winter holiday period.

A request for a donation of \$75, to purchase sticks and socks for the Ballantrae Hockey Club, submitted by team manager, Jack Palmer, was turned down. However, the committee agreed to grant a sum, not exceeding \$50, for the purchase of hockey socks only, with bills to be submitted to the secretary.

Vice-chairman Bill Paine spoke highly of the Saturday Walt Disney movies, held at 9.30 a.m. in the Vandorf Community Hall. The admission charge

is 50 cents. Mr. Paine said the shows had proven very entertaining to children in the area and suggested the Committee consider subsidizing the program to keep it going.

A Community Conference will be held in mid-April, dealing with all areas of recreation in Whitechurch-Stouffville.
