## Region of York

### Moves to assume Family Life program

YORK REGION - The Region is moving to take over Markham's Family Life Centre, and to establish two similar branches. The Richmond Hill-Thornhill Centre will also be absorbed by the Region.

In a report considered by Regional Council, Jan. 27, the Health and Social Services Committee cited "a definite need and interest". Discussions with provincial officials have secured a promise that the Department of Social

and Family Services will pay 50 percent of the cost of salaries and fringe benefits of counselling staff. It is proposed that the Region will pay the other 50 percent, while "local non-profit boards" would underwrite office accommodation and utilities.

The report concluded with a recommendation that the "Region's" Commissioner of Health and Social Services be authorized to hire the staff of the two existing Centres, and establish new Centres at Newmarket and Sutton. These two new Centres appear to be set up on a half-year basis. The total cost to the Region in 1972 would be \$35,000, while the province would pay the same amount.

Local organizations would be expected to raise almost \$19,000. Council members voted acceptance of the report, after brief discussion. Mario Bartoletti, Director of the Markham Centre, address Council at its next meeting, Feb. 10.

The funeral was held Monday Jan. 31 from the Jerrett 'Willowdale' Chapel with interment, York Cemetery.

The pallbearers were Wayne Morrison, Ken Siefreid, Lyonell, Douglas and Bobby Cook, Douglas Ramer.

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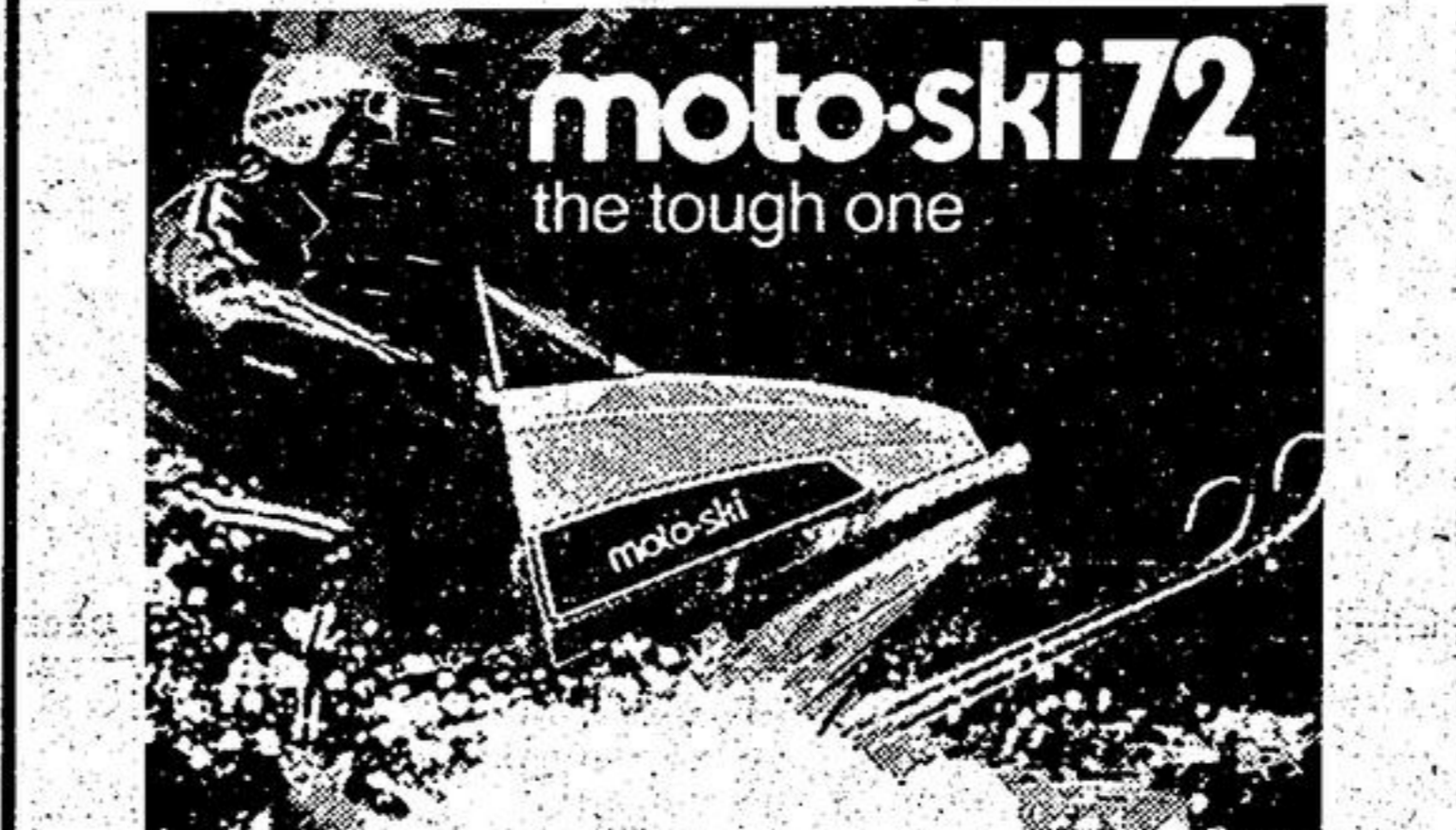

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# \$50 to catch a dog

UXBRIDGE TWP. - "If we spent \$3,000 in 1971 on dog control and we caught 96 dogs, 75 of which were disposed of, then it's costing us \$50 to catch one dog".

Councillor Muirhead made this rough cost-results calculation during a discussion on dog control in Uxbridge Township.

Mrs. Ann Barrett, Dog Control Officer, explained that it cost her \$5 to have a dog destroyed, although the fee was less if more than one was taken in at a time. Deputy-Reeve Jackson suggested that perhaps some sort of contract could be made, with the veterinarian, that would reduce the charges.

Council made a resolution to charge \$5 per dog, for stray dogs given new homes, to defray the cost of board while in Township custody; \$2 to go to the Dog Control Officer and \$3 to the Township.

It was also resolved that the Bylaw Enforcement Officer, in consultation with Mrs. Barrett, send letters of warning to owners of nuisance dogs, running-at-large; to be followed, if necessary, by legal proceedings, to give the warning some 'bite'.

Meanwhile, it was learned, the pound in Goodwood is nearing completion and, perhaps by the end of next month, will be ready to house the Township's \$50 strays.
