Extended care program Apr. 1

STOUFFVILLE — Although many details still remain to be finalized, the Ontario Extended Care program is scheduled to go into effect April 1, 1972.

This program is being developed by the Department of Health, the Ontario Hospital Services Commission, and the Department of Social and Family Services, and will extend hospital insurance benefits to Residents of Charitable and Municipal Homes for the Aged, privately operated Nursing Homes, and Homes for Special Care.

The new extended coverage should ease the financial burden for the many persons — mostly elderly — in Ontario who require long term nursing care and supervision, as well as upgrading and making more uniform standards of nursing care across the Province. It marks a milestone in Government assistance to our Senior Citizens.
