Well-known area auctioneer

AGINCOURT - Veteran auctioneer and farmer, Gordon Sellers, passed away suddenly, Feb. 7, following a heart attack at his home, "Sunrise Farm", Bellamy Road in Scarborough.

Mr. Sellers was born at this location in 1890 and spent all his life there. He took over its operation in 1915.

Gordon Sellers was a familiar figure in the sales ring, waving his cane in the air and calling successful bidders by their first names. He had a wonderful sense of humor, common to most auctioneers, a trait that gained him a wide circle of friends. Gordon Sellers was well known in Stouffville, where he worked at the local Sales Barn for 12 years, often shoulder-to-shoulder with his brother-in-law, Walter Atkinson.

Surviving, besides his wife, the former Elizabeth Webster, are two sons, Hartley and Franklin and two daughters, Irene (Mrs. G.S. Stirling) and Isobel (Mrs. D. Rogerson). There are also two sisters, Louella (Mrs. J. Simpson) of Exeter and Leona (Mrs. Walter Atkinson) of Stouffville.

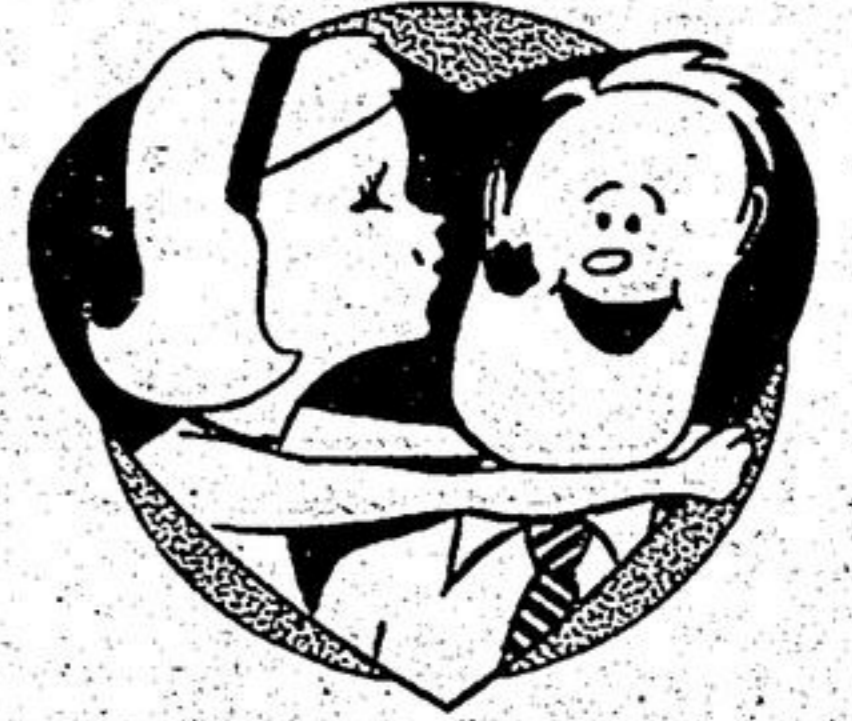

YORK-ONTARIO Truck licenses, including those eligible for a reduced farm rate, will go on sale throughout the province on March 1, it has been announced. The reduced fee will be available eligible for a grant under the Farm Tax Reduction program. Such farmers must occupy property assessed as farms and be 11 acres or more in size. A farm of less than 11 acres may also qualify if it produced an income of \$2,000 or more the preceding year. Upon application farmers will be required to sign a declaration certifying they are eligible for the reduced rate. Declaration forms will be available at all license bureaus.
