**NOTICE REGARDING: Dogs Running at Large**

Section 8 of By-Law 71-76 for the Town reads as follows:

(i) No owner of a dog shall allow the dog to run at large within the limits of the Municipality of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville.

(ii) For purposes of this section a dog shall be deemed to be running at large when found on a highway or other public place and not under the control of any person.

(iii) No owner of a dog shall allow the dog to howl or bark excessively or otherwise become a nuisance.

Every person who contravenes the foregoing is guilty of an offence and is liable upon Summary Conviction to a fine not exceeding \$50.00, exclusive of costs and every such fine is recoverable under the Summary Convictions Act.

LICENSING  
Every owner of a dog is required to have a Licence (tag) by February 15th each year. Obtain yours at the Municipal Office. Failure to obtain a licence by the above date is also an offence subject to a fine not exceeding \$50.00.
