STOUFFVILLE - The church exerted itself and went out among the people. And that's exactly what it will do as part of a Stouffville Easter Memorial Christian Crusade, beginning Good Friday and extending through Easter Monday.

While the Youth Centre will serve as a base camp, the 'outreach' will include personal contact with residents in their homes and on the street.

Each evening, after 8:30 p.m., Crusade members will visit Stouffville, Markham and other residential areas to seek out young people in need - not only of the Gospel, but in need of food and over-night accommodation.

All meals will be provided in the lower auditorium of the Stouffville Christian Church.

It is the first 'outreach' program of its kind in Stouffville. "Stouffville has, for a long time, been a centre for evangelism," said Mr. Barker, "with a number of churches regularly preaching the Gospel. However, the need is for God's people to put 'legs on their faith' and go out with the Gospel to the 'man in the street'."

Mr. Barker said that community services such as this, have proved very successful elsewhere in Canada and overseas.
