> On the morning of Feb. 23, Mr. Warriner was loading corn from a round granary into a truck. A tractor-driven auger was used to load about 16 tons of corn into the truck. Finally, the truck was filled and the tractor was put on idle. The 47 foot long auger is inside a long pipe with the open drive shaft underneath.

"I was standing beside the auger and I wanted to move it out of the granary. As I was pulling it out, the bottom of my coat got caught in the shaft. In a split second I was in it. It tore my coat off, except for my left sleeve. The shear pin on the drive shaft was cut but before the coat ripped it was wound around my arm and the shaft," he explained.
