# Goodwood not Queen - Yonge

GOODWOOD - The Tindall Subdivision (west half, lot 16, Conc. 3), a subject which goes back in planning records to 1957, stumbled in and out of the Uxbridge Twp. agenda again. Councillor Hendy Benny Ugar, Markham, the latest developer to take an interest in this land, expressed disapproval of the \$500 lot fee which the township proposes to levy. The lot fee came into effect last year, but Mr. Ugar's plans had been given approval long before that. Council reasoned that had he acted on the plans then, no fee would have been necessary. Reeve Robert Nesbitt said the land had changed hands a few times since '57 and various people had introduced proposals. He re-read resolution, passed last year, that state details regarding the Tindall Subdivision would have to be concluded by August 1971. Councillor Hendy Benny Ugar, said that he could not sympathize with Mr. Ugar. "I was of Council for a year and I had hoped this was all cleared up. I feel you should pay the \$500 lot fee." Mr. Ugar conceded that Council had operated well with him but questioned, "Does Council not feel there should be some little give - say, split the lot fee?" He commented that land has only so much value and this wasn't the corner of Queen and Yonge. Members of Council stood by the resolution to negotiate no further in this matter.
