

Successful horse auction sale exceeds \$20,000

STOUFFVILLE - The Stouffville Sales Barn was recently the scene of one of the largest horse sales ever held in Ontario.

The event, April 3, attracted crowds of horse-lovers who filled the parking lot and crammed the auction ring. Manager Frank Wilbur reported that people attended from as far distant as Prince Edward Island, Quebec and New York State.

The horses, about 150 of them, also came from widely separated locations, including Oklahoma and Arkansas. In terms of dollar volume, the total money spent is estimated at over \$20,000.

"It was much bigger than we expected", said Mr. Wilbur. "Most of the people were horse people, too. Probably the holiday Monday helped".

The bulk of the sale on Monday was registered stock, although a large amount of tack was also sold.

The Sales Barn is now making arrangements for another big sale, May 1. This will be a double event - horses during the afternoon and boats, trailers and campers during the evening.

This next event has all the makings of being another standing-room only auction. As of April 4, twenty-five horses had already been registered.

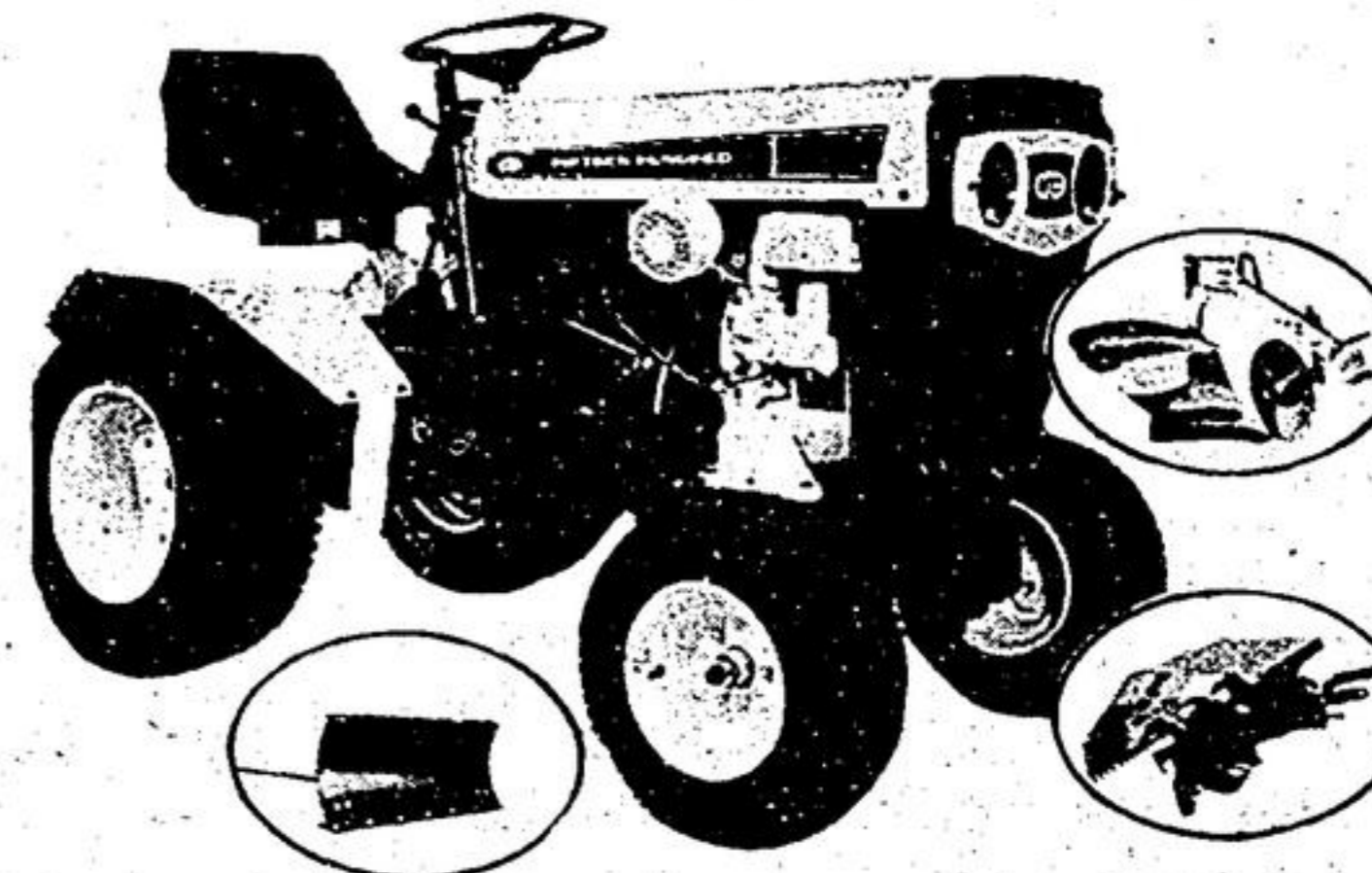
