Regional police budget shows no increase

YORK REGION - The Regional Police budget does not show any actual increase this year, and Police Commissioner Gordon Cook wants the fact noted.
 At a meeting of the Commission April 10, Mr. Cook pointed out that the province has increased per capita grants for police work. This increase, said Mr. Cook, would wipe out the apparent increase which the original police budget showed.
 Unlike many of the York Region departments, the police budget did not show revenue. Mr. Cook felt that this extra revenue should be shown, and a net figure representing the actual money which the Region has to raise given as the budget figure.
 "This would produce a more accurate picture", observed Chairman Judge William Lyons. Other members were inclined to agree.
 The Commission voted to have its secretary, Brian Ward, contact the Regional Treasurer with this request. Ray Twinney, a member of both the Commission and Regional Council, promised to bring this matter to the attention of the Council.
