Approve new school addition

GREENWOOD - The Ontario County Board of Education has tentatively decided to proceed with a planned addition to Greenwood's Valley View School, airport or no airport.

Trustees reviewed a report at a recent meeting, which indicated that Valley View might be affected by noise from aircraft. Citing the school's position atop a hill, and its location 3½ miles from the end of a runway, the report suggested high noise levels might be experienced when the airport is operational.

Several Board officials visited schools in the area of Malton airport to study noise factors. Their report, however, stopped short of saying that Valley View would have to be closed. Plans for an addition to the school are to be presented soon.

A contract for an extension to Claremont Public School has already been awarded. Another study is presently in progress, to determine future school needs in the new city scheduled to go along with the airport project.

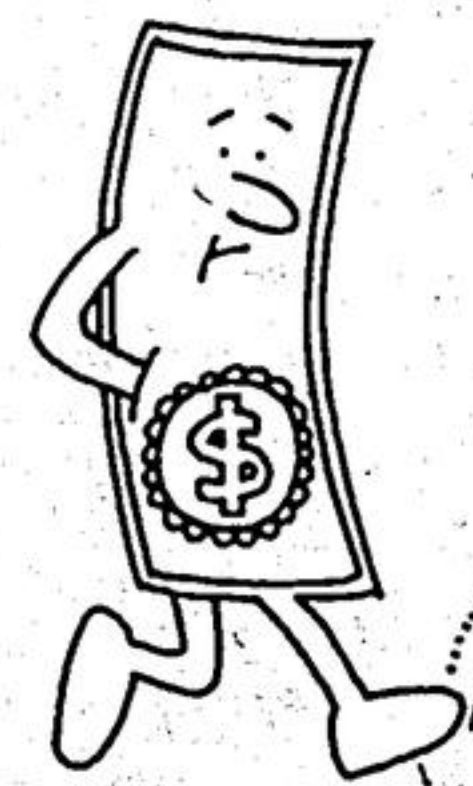

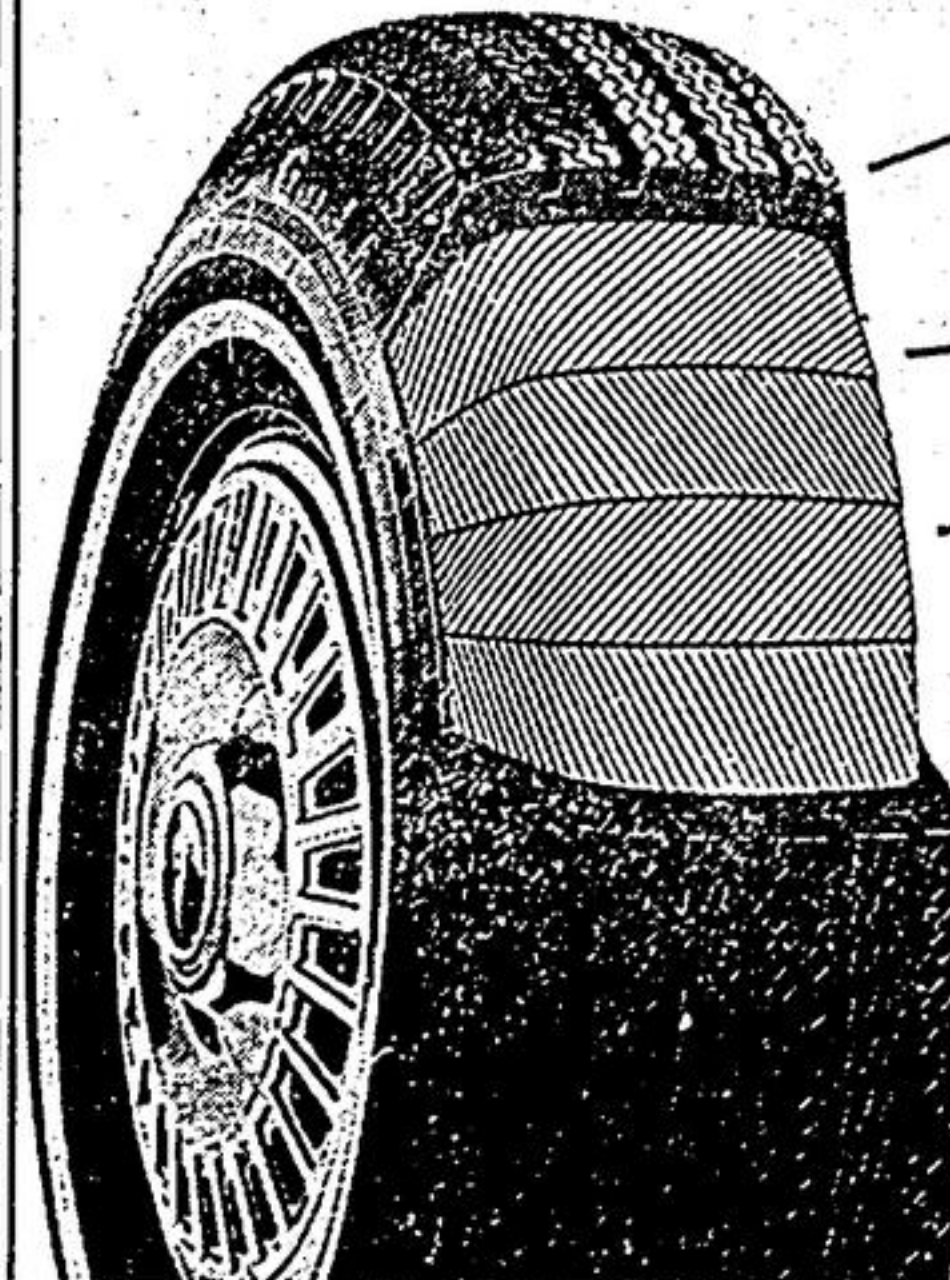
