**BLOOMINGTON** - In memory of Mrs. Vera McGarry, R.R.2, Stouffville, a bursary has been established in her name, at York University, by Local 373 of the Canadian Union of Public Employees. Mrs. McGarry, a former president of the Local, was killed, Jan. 12, in a single-car accident near Gormley. The initial contribution to the fund is \$2,500. The interest will go to students of good academic standing requiring financial assistance, preferably those with some athletic ability.

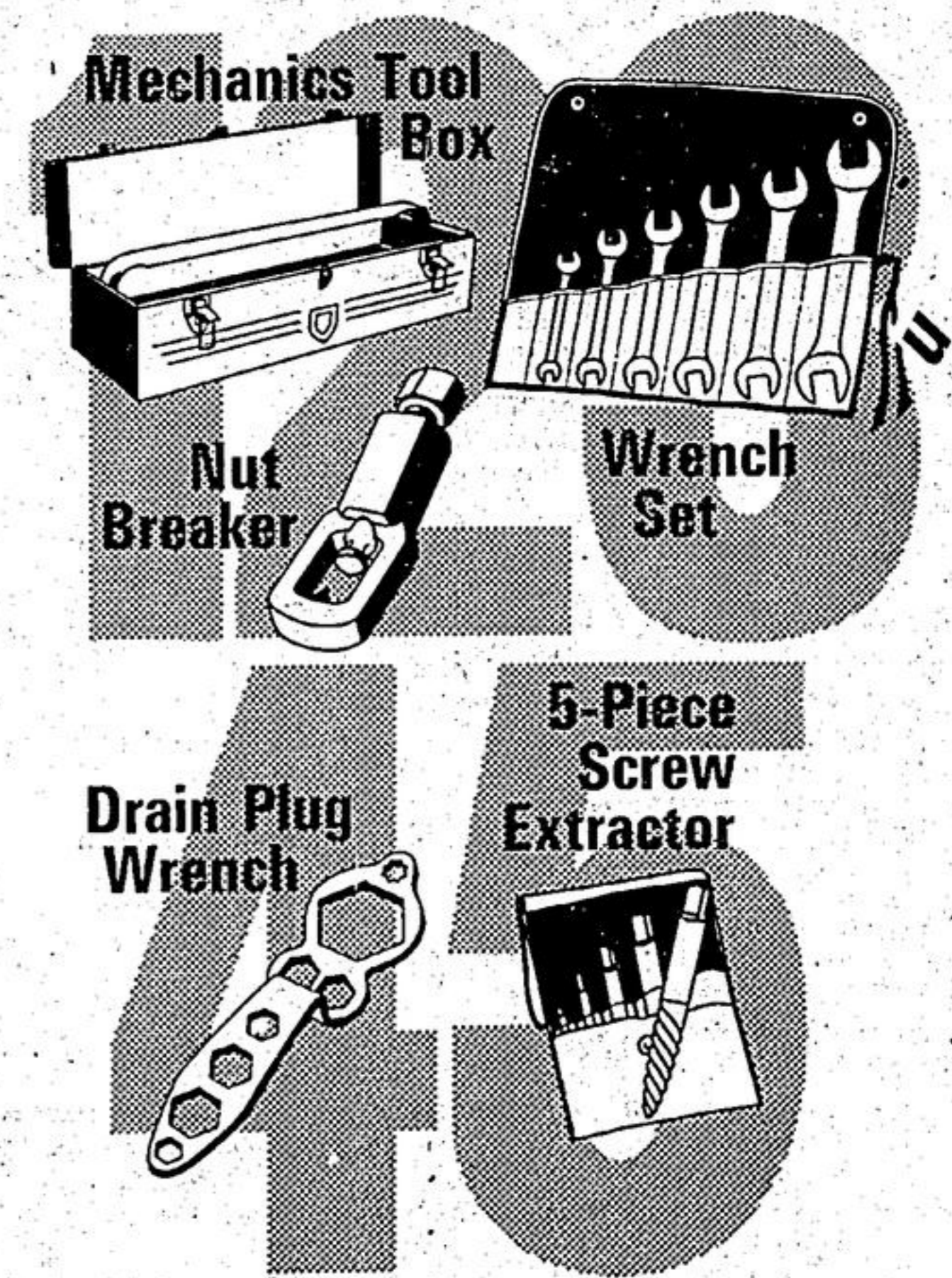
