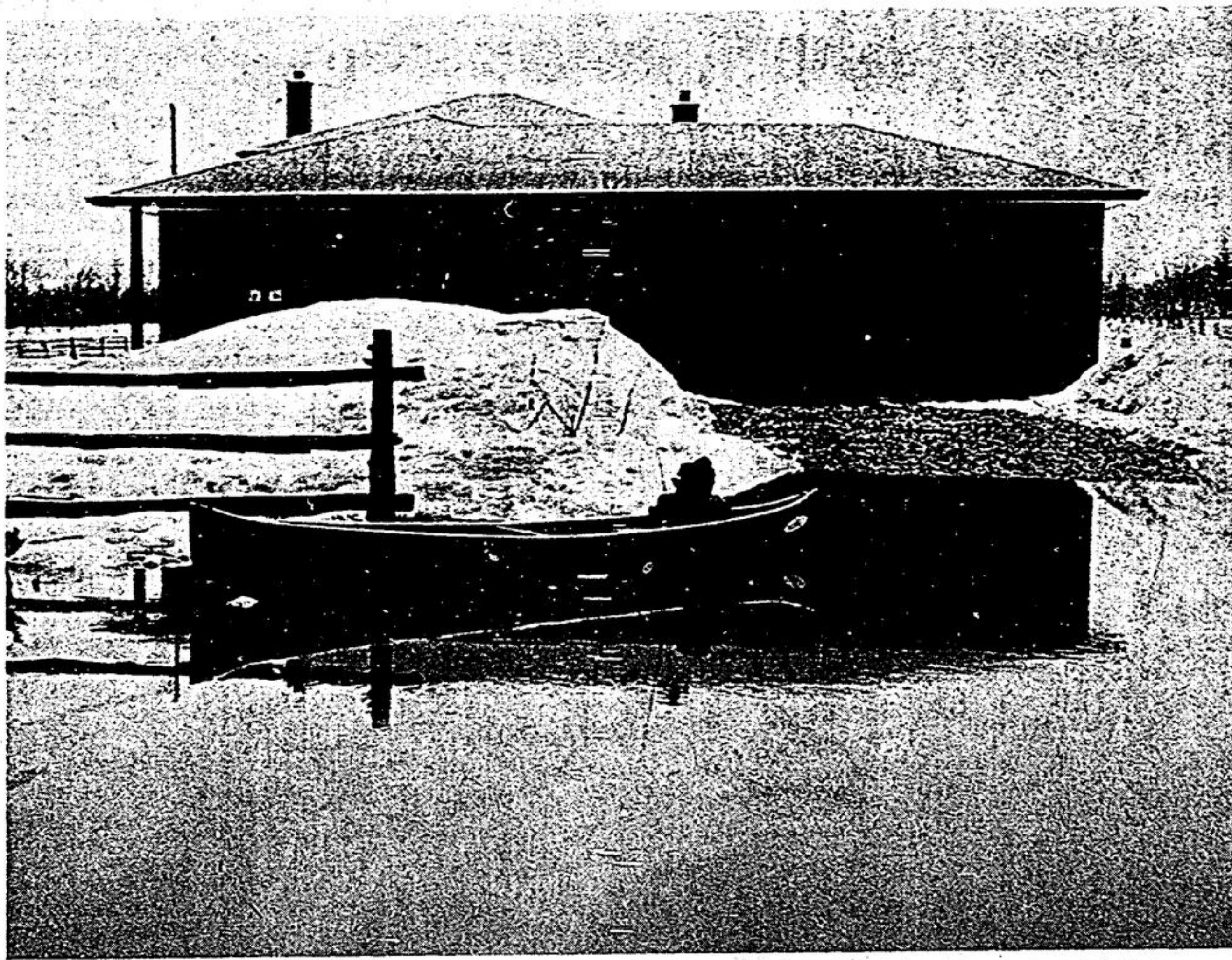
Wesley McLaren entertained a number of friends, Saturday, on the occasion of his 8th birthday.

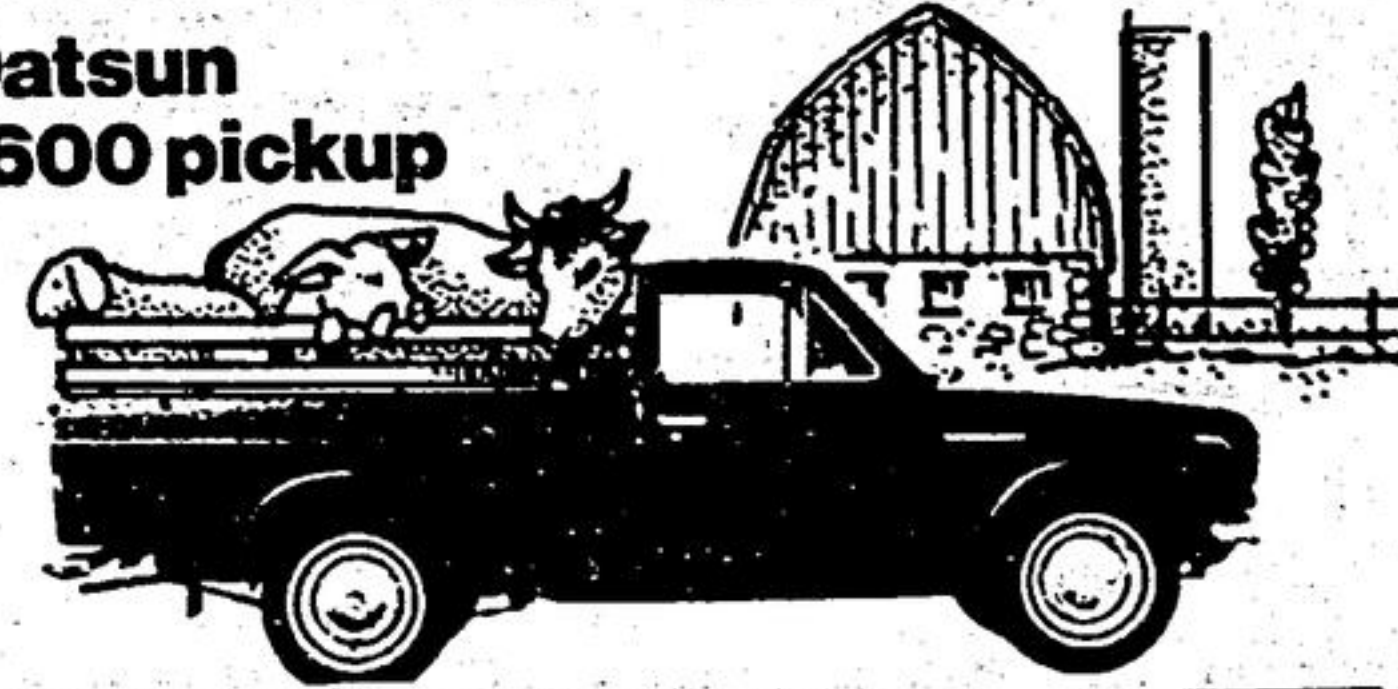

Hall is meant for this kind of use," observed Board Secretary Tom Lonergan.

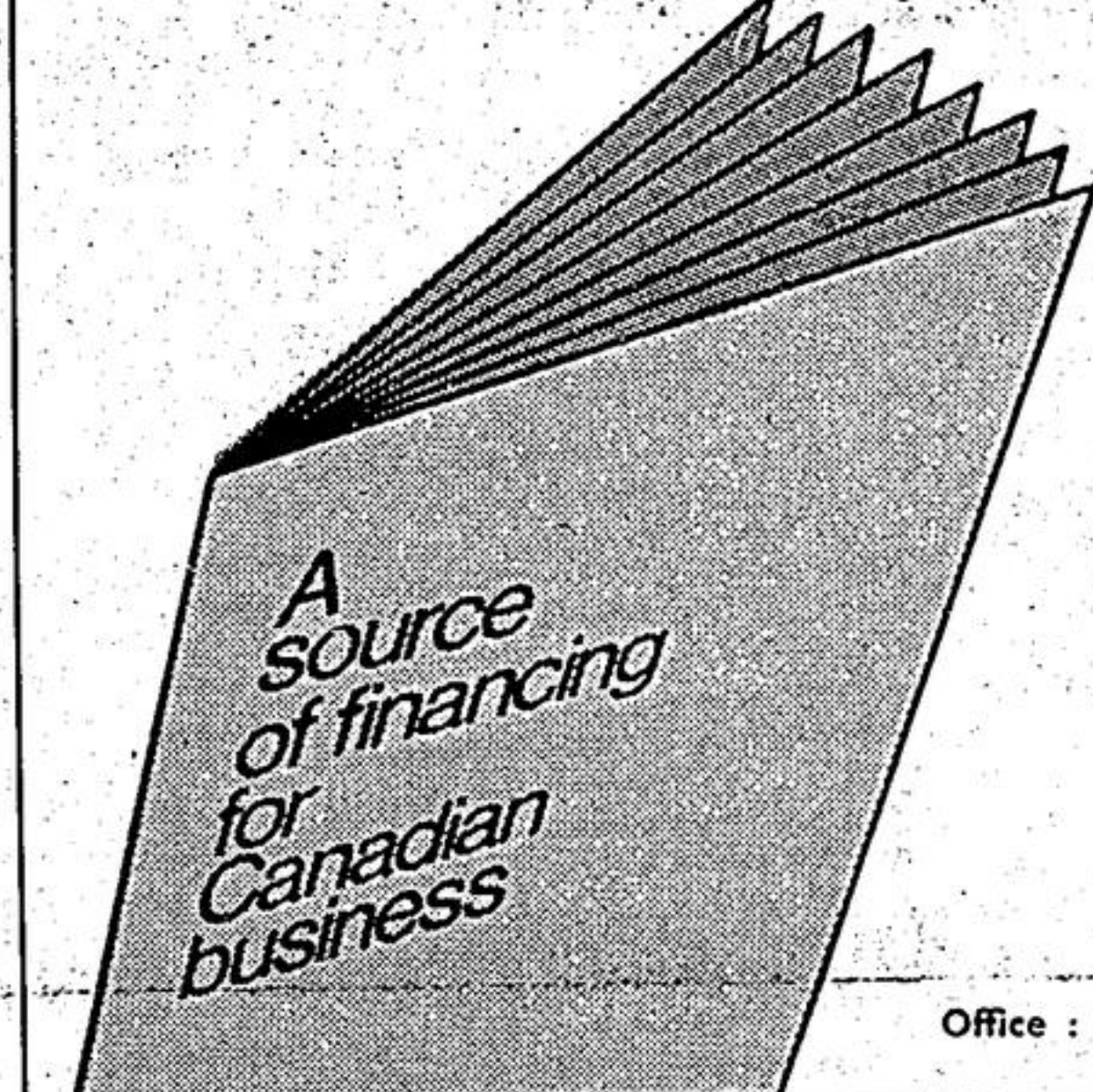
"The money isn't enough; it works out to about \$19 a Sunday," said Wilf Morley.

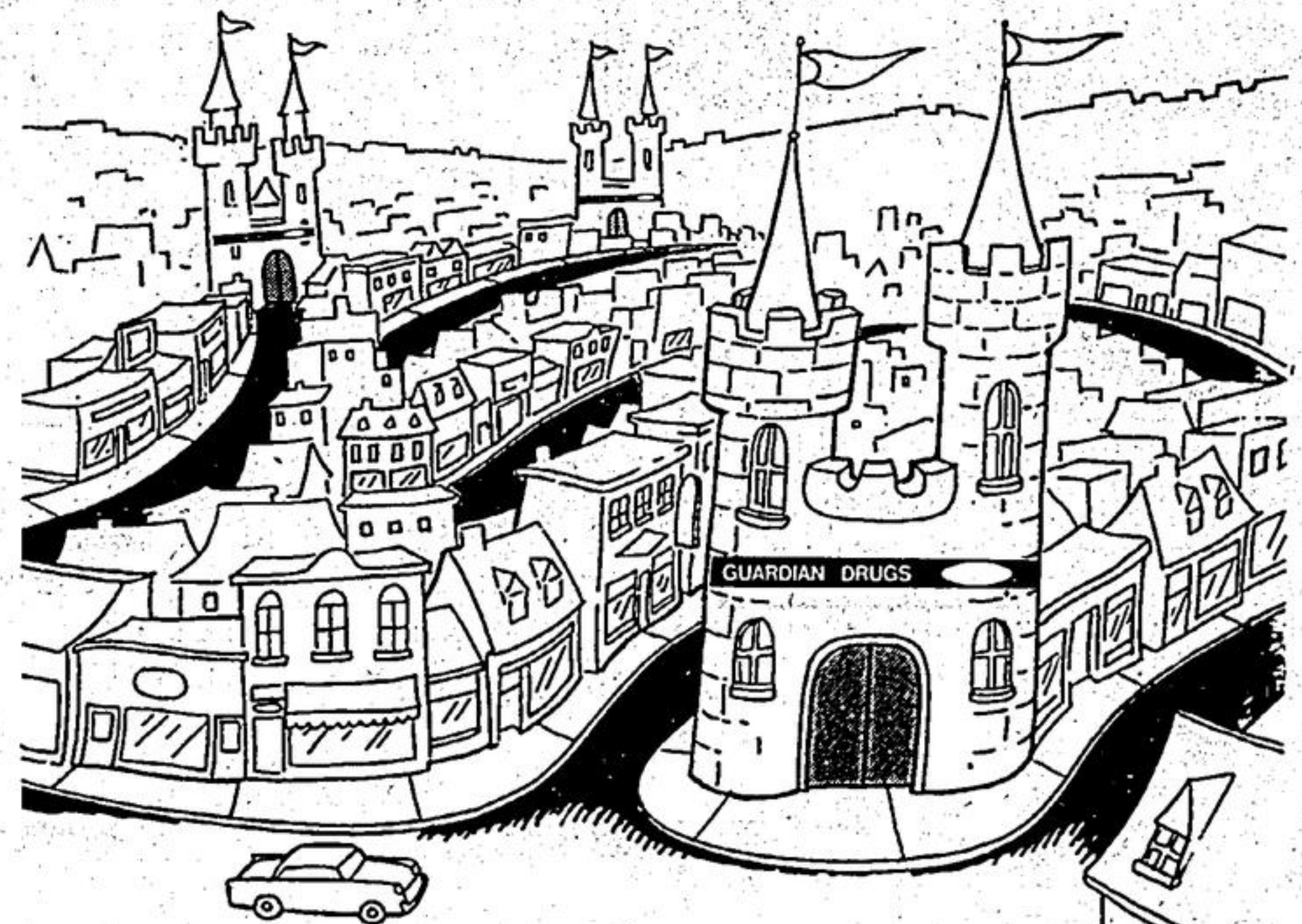

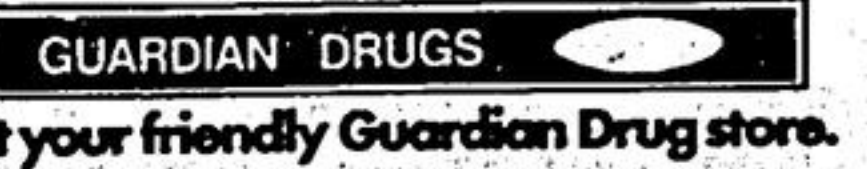
