Firm buys site

VANDORF An application by Helmac-Roth Limited of Willowdale, for permission to erect a plant, 170 ft. by 90 ft., on a 4-acre site, near the intersection of Don Mills and the Aurora Sideroad, received favorable consideration at a Whitchurch-Stouffville Planning Committee meeting, April 28.

With highway frontage of 420 feet and the area properly zoned, councillor Herb Simpson recommended immediate action on the proposal. He said the acquisition of industrial assessment, plus added employment opportunities, represented a two-way benefit for the town.

Councillor Gordon Ratcliff noted the proximity of proposed Hwy. 404 to the west, indicating the ease of future access to the site. He warned, however, that the Committee should decide if the location is suitable for industrial build-up. He said personally, he would favor the creation of an industrial park on the property in question.

Members expressed agreement in principle with the application and recommended the Area Services Branch of York Region prepare a list of conditions. "Let's get something started," concurred Mayor Ken Lausway. A tour of the Willowdale Plant may be arranged at a future date.



(b) the inquiry officer, (i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and (ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:

"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll;
