The Life And Times Of Joseph Gould

by W. H. Higgins (Centennial Edition)

Joseph Gould was a man for all seasons, whose family came to Uxbridge from Pennsylvania. Born at Quaker Hill, Gould was already a prominent man in Uxbridge when he joined the Mackenzie Rebellion in 1837 to fight the Family Compact.

Captured and imprisoned at Kingston for almost a year he returned to Uxbridge, married, became a driving force in his town and his province. A fighter for reform causes despite his wealth and business emenence, Gould was often an opponent of John A. Macdonald when both served in the Canadian Parliament.

This biography first published in 1887 by C. Blackett Robinson of Toronto is now reissued in a facsimile edition which makes available at popular prices the whole colorful Gould and Uxbridge story.

An afterword has been added to the original complete book and this brings the history of Uxbridge up to 1972.
