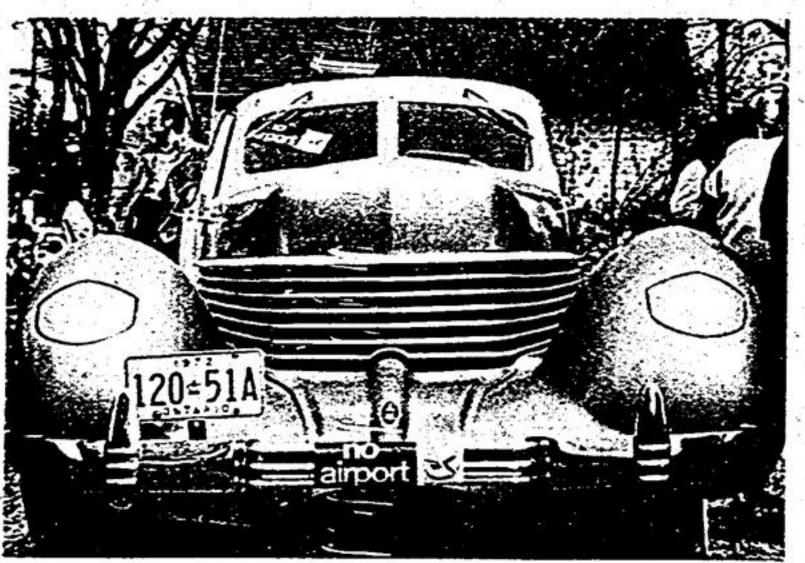

Spokesmen at the meeting claimed that much of the time Malton airport was in chaos because of overcrowding and further extensions could not be tolerated by the thousands of residents close by.

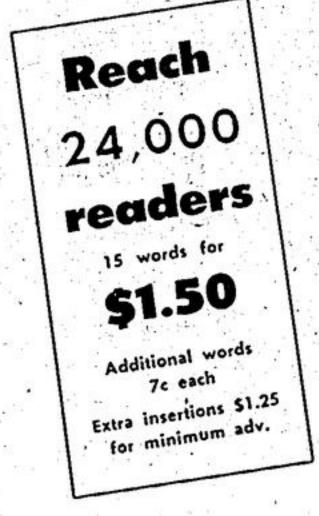
