

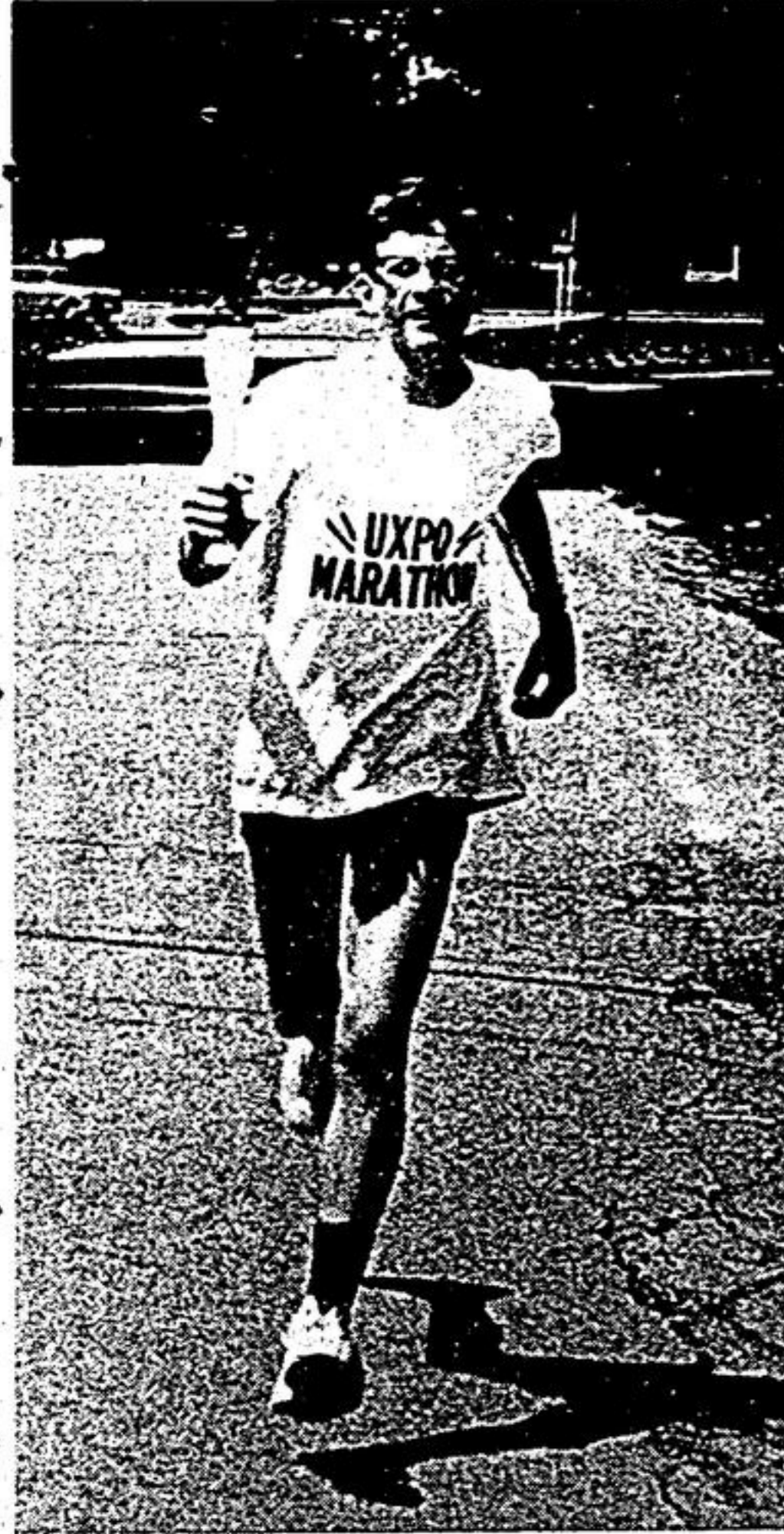

**STOUFFVILLE** - The names of six student athletes have been written into the records as the 1972 Stouffville Public School track and field champions.

The three boys and three girls will be honored when their schools hold an Awards Ceremony, later this month.

**Pool open Sunday**

**STOUFFVILLE** - The Town swimming pool will open this Sunday, June 11, at 1:30.

Pool manager Peter Sanderson expressed the hope that it might be possible to open, Saturday, but was doubtful this could be done. The first day, Sunday, will see the pool open for general swimming from 1:30 to 5:30.

The fee schedule for various courses offered this summer follow: Moms & Tots, \$5; wading pool, \$5; children and students, \$8; adult, \$10; and diving instruction, \$5. These programs will all run for four weeks in each of July and August.

All-summer courses will be given in competitive swimming (\$5), and the cot-lager's one-week special program will also cost \$5.

Season tickets for the family, including a month of instruction, will cost \$45 this

summer, or \$25 without instruction courses. Other season prices will be: adult, \$12; students (12 and over) \$8; and children, \$6. A seven-day visitor's pass is priced at \$1.50 for children, or \$3 for students.

**STOUFFVILLE** - Cliff Dunkeld of Stouffville finished 7th with a 3-game total of 772 in the president, secretary, treasurers bowling tournament, held at Guelph.

**House League rolling**

**STOUFFVILLE** - The best-organized House League program ever established in Stouffville, has 14 girls' and boys' teams already playing this season.

The main 'push' behind this project is Will Morley, a member of the Whitechurch-Stouffville Recreation Committee.

To handle this number of players, requires 33 coaches. All are selected and accounted for.

"Some of the poor guys never saw their teams until game time, but they seemed to make out alright," said Mr. Morley. Every ball diamond in town is in use, including the fields at Orchard Park and Summitview Schools.

**STOUFFVILLE** - Student athletes are seldom accorded a standing ovation, even at athletic assemblies.

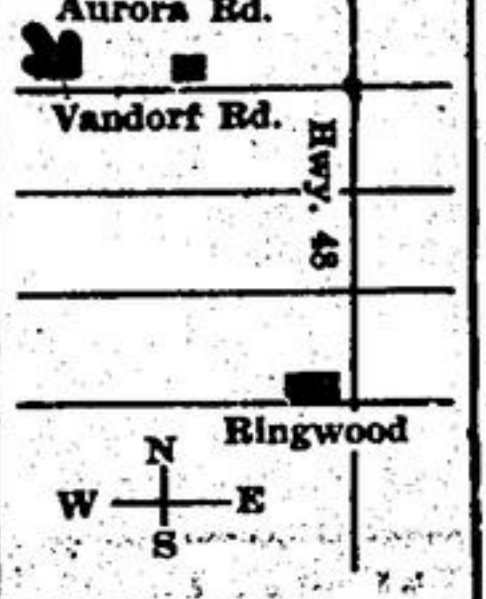
Such a rarity occurred, June 1, at Stouffville Dist. Secondary School - in recognition of a non-athlete.
