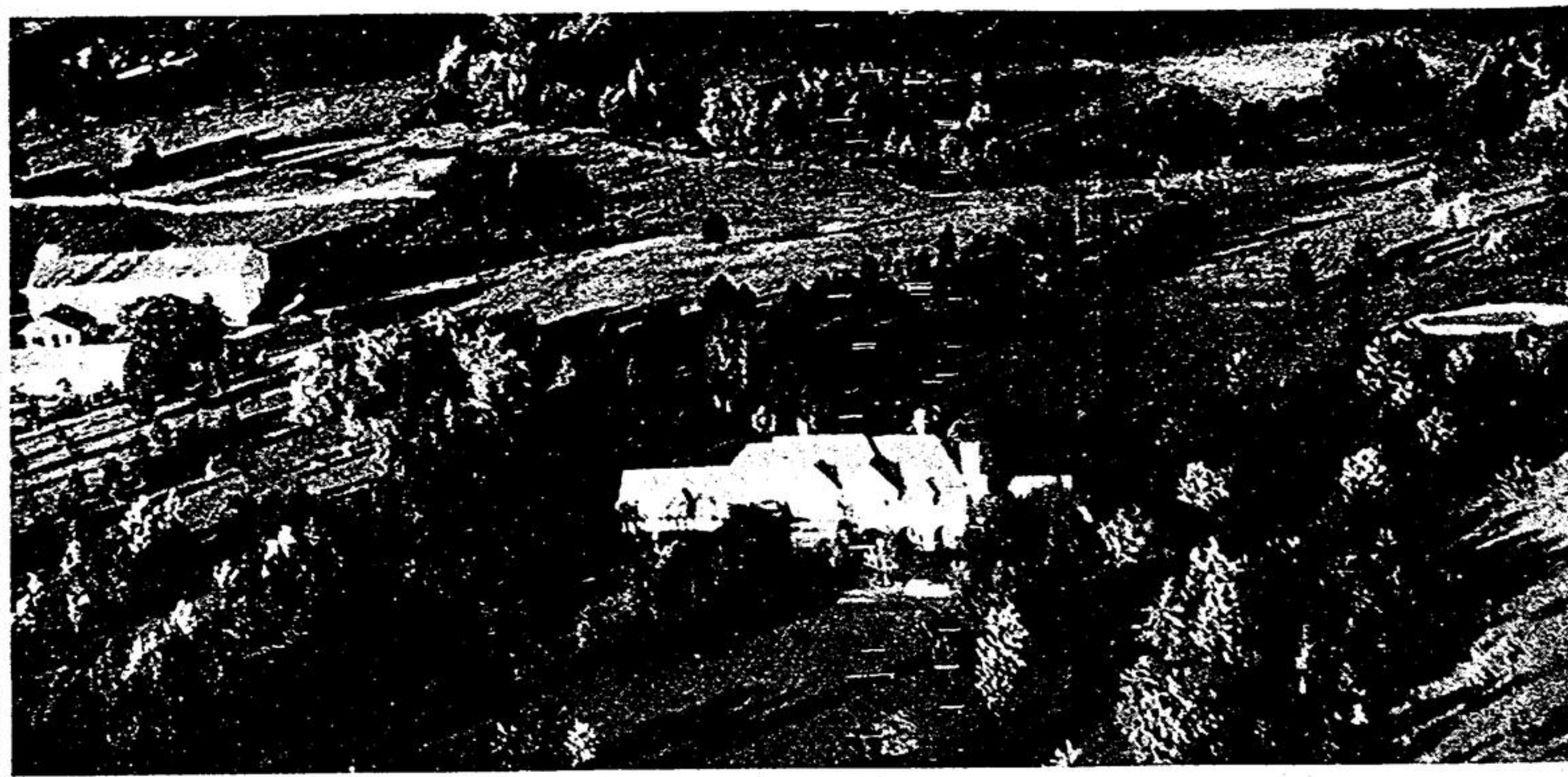


Barn burns
