To demolish postal landmark
 MILLIKEN - One of the area's long-standing landmarks, the Milliken Post Office, will be demolished shortly. The building on the north-east corner of Steeles Avenue and Kennedy Road, was purchased some time ago in connection with a rebuilding of the intersection. The Regional Engineering Committee reported June 8 to Council that the Department of Public Works has made arrangements to provide another Post Office in the area. Council voted to authorize the Commissioner of Engineering to call tenders for the demolition of the building.

Planner is 'director'

MARKHAM - A Tribune editorial (June 8), that criticized Markham Town Council for its laxity in not hiring a Planning Director to succeed Kumio Hidaka and not obtaining a Deputy Clerk to succeed Neil Brodie, has itself been criticized by a spokesman for the Town Planning Department. The caller said that as of April 25, Bill Power was indeed the Planning Director. He also said that Mr. Power had come as a highly-qualified employee to the municipality. The Tribune regrets that the promotion of Mr. Power was overlooked, but there was certainly no intent by the newspaper to question the official's ability to assume this post.

YORK REGION - The excrement was flying at a meeting of Regional Council, June 8.

Newmarket's Mayor Bob Forhan touched off the incident when he spoke to an Engineering Committee report concerning capacity of the Aurora sewage treatment plant. It is proposed to expand the plant, a responsibility of the Region.

Mayor Forhan observed that regulations allow Newmarket to dump more waste into the stream than Aurora can, and suggested the problem should be attacked at the headwaters.

"This won't help anything, when you've

got people dropping all kinds of excrement upstream," he said.

Mayor Forhan, however, used a somewhat more pithy and descriptive term than "excrement". Aside from a few smothered chuckles, the Word passed un-noticed - for awhile.
