School principal promoted

WHITCHURCH
 The students of Whitchurch Highlands Public School will have a new Principal, beginning with the fall term in September. He's Mr. Reginald Pembleton, presently a staff Principal in Wellington County.
 Mr. Pembleton will succeed Mr. Terry Gray, who goes to Newmarket as Principal of the 800 pupil Meadowbrook School there. Highlands' Vice-Principal, Mr. Lorne Payne has accepted a promotion to the position of Principal at Schomberg Public School.
 The program at Whitchurch Highlands will remain unchanged, Principal Gray said. He noted that Mr. Pembleton's knowledge of the system was a main reason behind the Board's decision.
 Enrollment at Whitchurch Highlands is expected to drop considerably in September to under 350, Mr. Gray said. At present, 450 students attend there. The main reason for the reduction is the changing of boundaries that will send pupils from Lake Wilcox and Shrubmount to Aurora and Newmarket respectively. He noted too, that in the remaining area, there was a general decrease in the school-age population.
 The term-end Graduation Night Program is June 26.
