Airport - majority will benefit

To the Editor:

I have read and heard much during the past weeks from organizations such as "P.O.W." and "P.O.P." These abbreviated titles are referred to as; "Progress over Welfare," "Pave our World," or "People or Planes." "Poverty over Prosperity."

I have listened to statistics to predictions, to propaganda to emotionalism and to sincere concern. On the one side I find reasonable, common sense determinations for an airport and its location. On the other side I find reasonable, common sense objections to an airport. I have tried to evaluate the two positions.

My evaluation of the "for" and "against" contributed to my decision to support the airport.

(1) There is more than sufficient evidence to show a new airport is needed.

(2) The selection of the Pickering Site was carefully and conscientiously made.

(3) The controls over pollution are adequate and commendable.

(4) The steps taken to protect our environment are very comprehensive.

(5) The noise or annoyance factor is restricted to as few people as possible.

The objections to the airport seem to originate with a minority of people who are being adversely affected, and we can appreciate their position. However, I do not feel we can "stop the world and get off" as some pompous, so-called, "naturalists" would suggest.

As a High School teacher, I feel I must, in fairness to my students, support a forward step that can do so much to provide something for their future.

I challenge all students of Southern Ontario to look ahead, plan ahead, become informed on an issue of such economic significance as this. As you research and make your judgements, remember:

(1) We are slowing outside investment to encourage more Canadian development in Canada.

(2) We have very few job opportunities at present.

(3) We have few opportunities for University Graduates.

(4) We have few development plans for the future of a sizeable nature except! This airport and all it will bring to our community.

An airport is an economic centre of gravity, it can be an economic transfusion into our system. An airport brings industry, tourists, conventions, considerable employment - And You QUALIFY.

Discover the facts, and the potential for yourselves, evaluate the sensationalism and emotionalism that is being stirred up against this airport, and don't just be a follower. Make your choice and work for it. Remember most of the objectors are secure, comfortable people with "Do not disturb" on their little domain.

Why can't we have People and Planes, they have always gone "upward" and "onward" together.
