School rentals

PICKERING TWP. - Both the federal and provincial governments are anxious to obtain space in two older schools in Pickering Township.

The Council recently agreed to lease the Brock Road and Brougham schools from the Ontario County Board of Education. At a meeting of Council in Committee, held June 12, a representative appeared from the federal Department of Public Works. The Department is seeking the use of the Brougham school as offices for their staff while land acquisition for the Airport is in progress.

A similar request, to rent the Brock Road School, was made by a provincial representative, Doug Sauder. The province wants space to use while acquiring land for the North Pickering Community Development Project. The feeling among Council members was that the federal request presented no difficulties. The Township had planned, however, to use the Brock Road school to house some of its own staff.

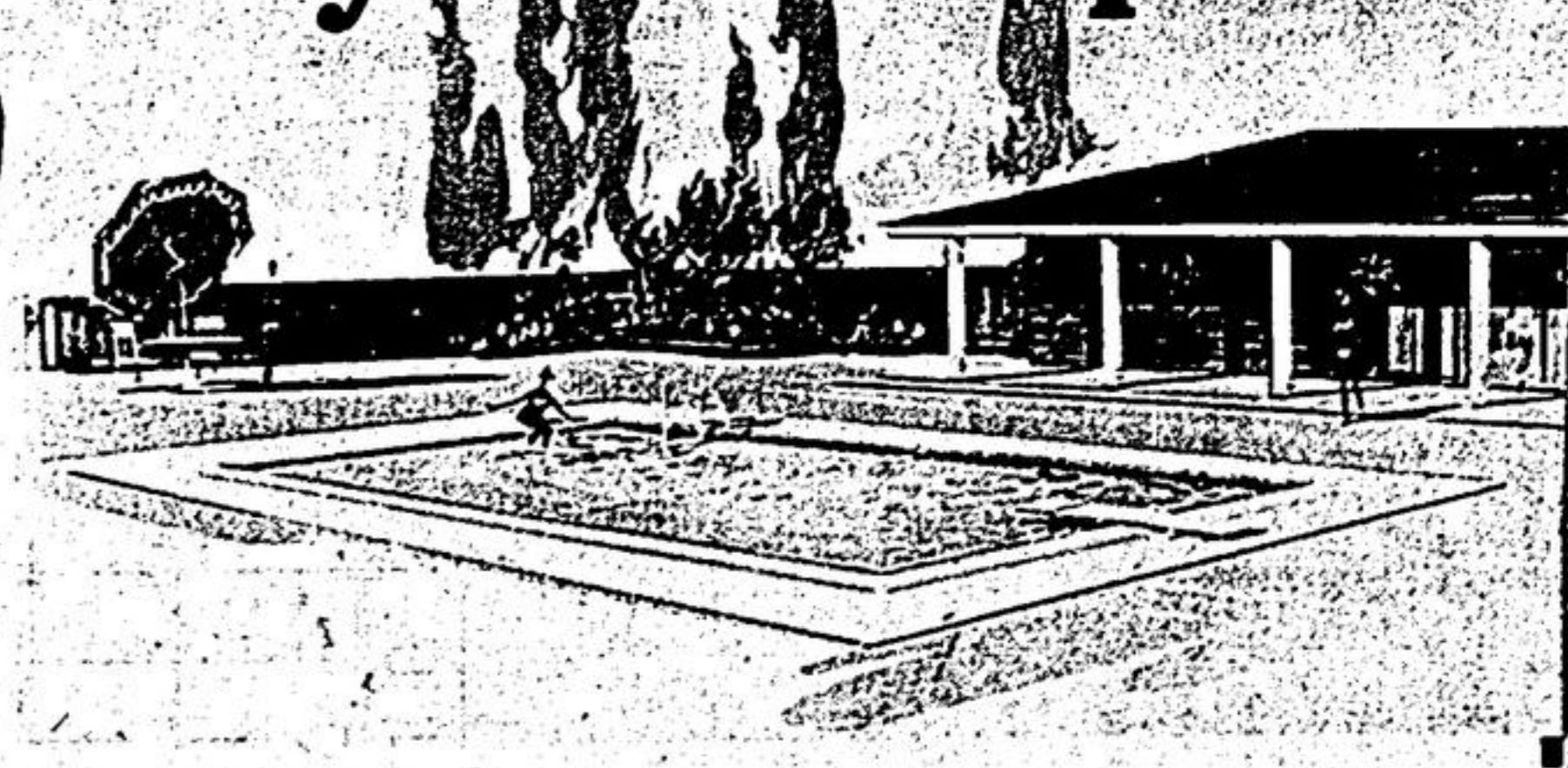
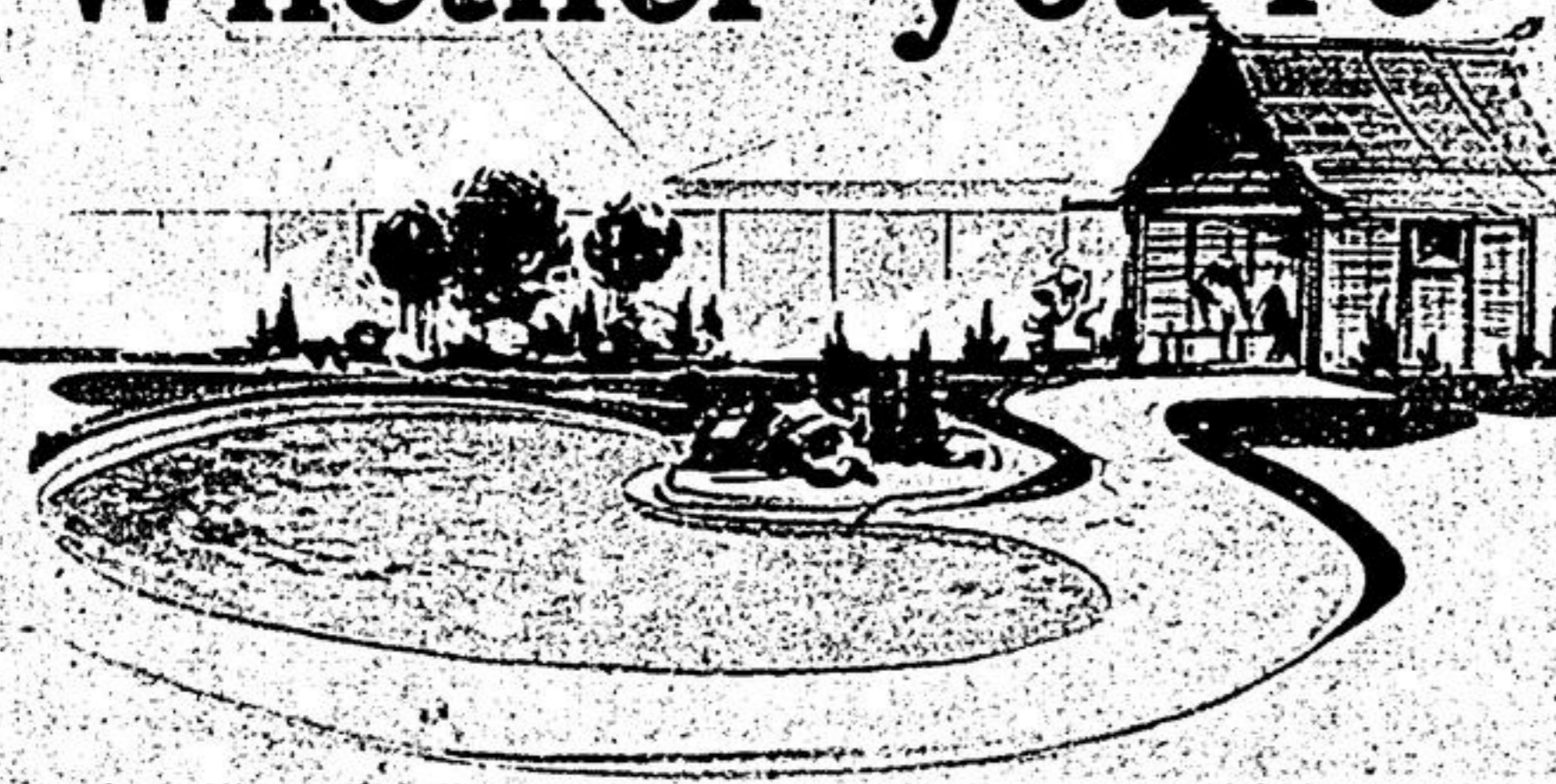
