The late Mrs. Baker was the former Martha Cooper. Deceased is survived by two sons, R.W. (Pat) of Rosedale and Jack of Fenelon Falls; also a daughter Lorna (Mrs. LeCraw). A son Grant and daughter Evelyn, (Mrs. L.A. Courtemanche) are both predeceased. A brother Frank resides in Toronto and there are twelve grandchildren.

The funeral on Thursday was conducted from the Platten Funeral Home with interment at Fenelon Falls.
