Mr. and Mrs. Ken Mercer had a successful auction sale, Saturday. They are now residing at their cottage residence on Lake Scugog. Ken and

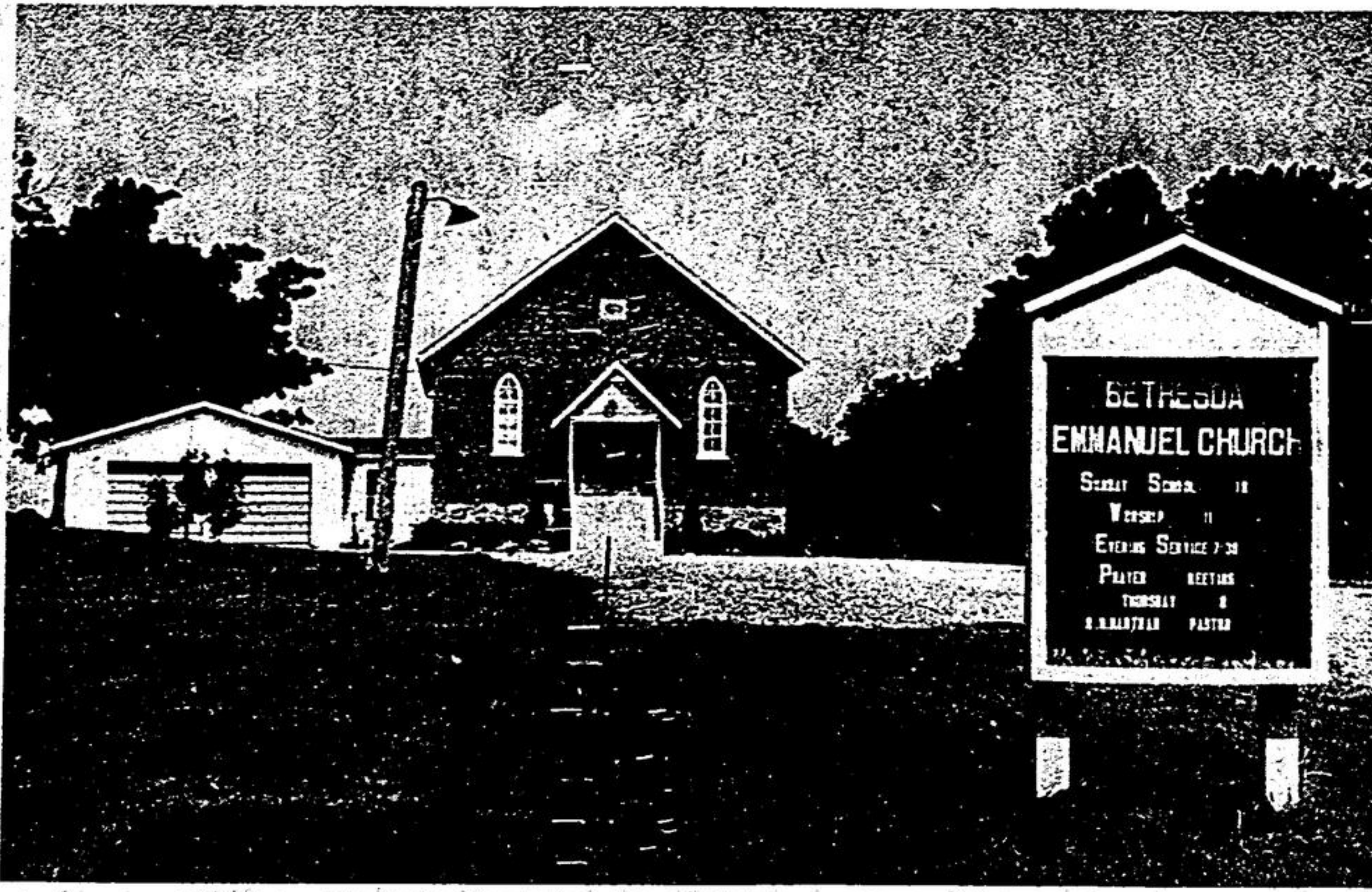
