### Close Whitby Arena

WHITBY - Acting swiftly on engineering report, Whitby Council has ordered the immediate closing and demolition of Whitby Arena.

Built in 1954, the arena was recently examined by a firm of consulting engineers. Their tests revealed extensive defects. including termite damage, split blocks, fractured truss members, unsafe seats and irregular settlement of the floor. A replacement arena, Council was told, would cost between \$700,000 and \$1 million.

At the same time the Whitby Arena was closed, Council ora close dered examination of the Brooklin Arena.

The closing will mean cancellation of activities planned for the for-Garage, on the south side of Goodwood. In addition to theoming winter season. The town's minor hockey program may be affected. Council has ap-

pointed a committee to examine all possibilities of building a new arena.
