## Close Whitby Arena

**WHITBY** - Acting swiftly on an engineering report, Whitby Council has ordered the immediate closing and demolition of Whitby Arena.

Built in 1954, the arena was recently examined by a firm of consulting engineers. Their tests revealed extensive defects, including termite damage, split blocks, fractured truss members, unsafe seats and irregular settlement of the floor. A replacement arena, Council was told, would cost between \$700,000 and \$1 million.

At the same time the Whitby Arena was closed, Council ordered a close examination of the Brooklin Arena.

The closing will mean cancellation of many activities planned for the forthcoming winter season. The town's minor hockey program may be affected.

Council has appointed a committee to examine all possibilities of building a new arena.

**UXBRIDGE TWP.** - The Department of Transportation and Communications will be taking over 200 feet of some Township sideroads temporarily.

Council was notified of this at a meeting July 31. As part of a general reconstruction of Highway 47, between Stouffville and

Goodwood, the DT&C will be rebuilding intersections where sideroads join the highway. When the work is completed, the roads will revert to the Township.

Indications were that the work is to begin soon, although no date was specified. Highway 47 is to be extended east from

Stouffville to the Townline and north along that road, bypassing its present location along the 10th Line.

A brief discussion revealed Councillors to be in general agreement with the plan. A resolution was passed, stating that the Township agrees to the reconstruction and will re-assume the sideroads where improvements are to be done.
