Music in the air

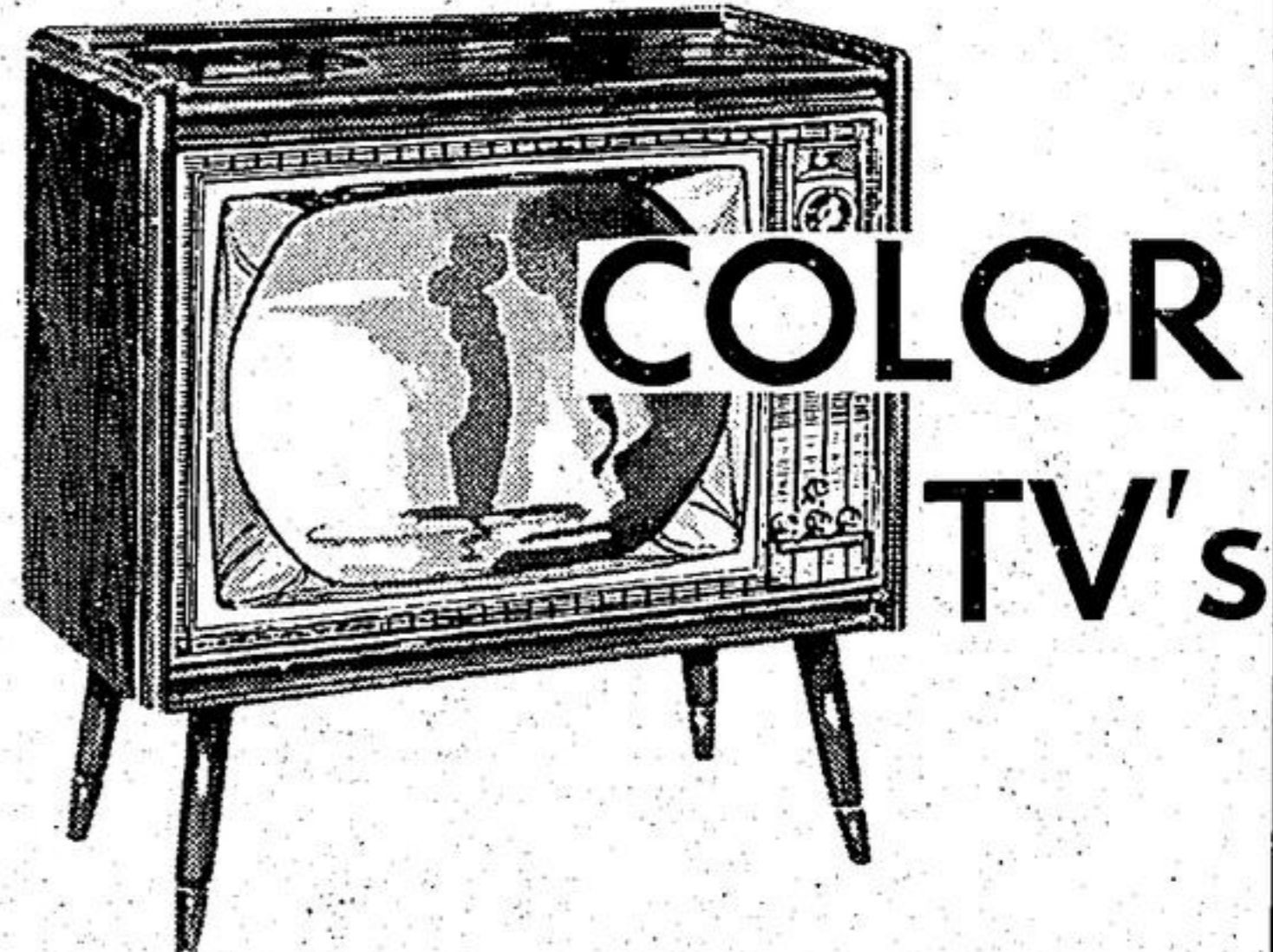

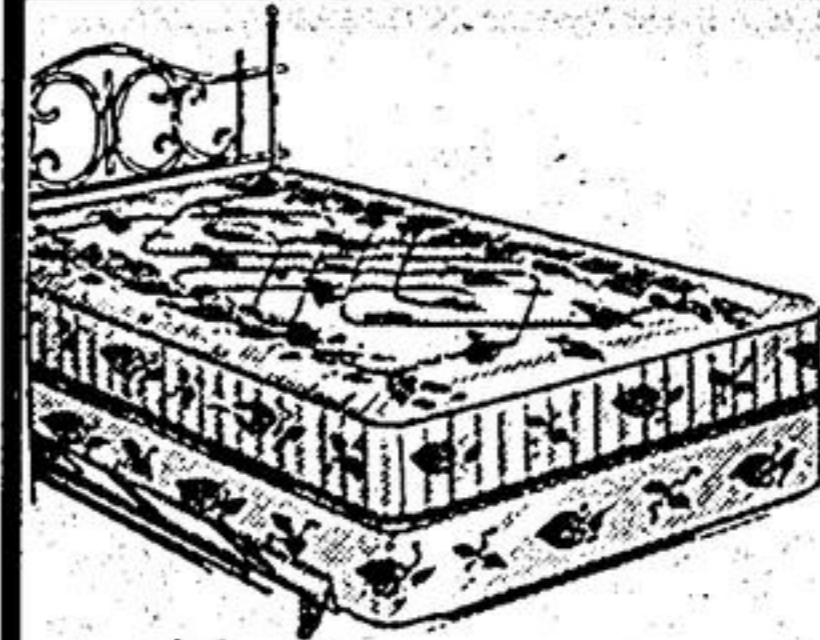
