Park attendance down

Attendance at the many Conservation Parks in this area, is down so far this summer. The parks, including Bruce's Mill, Claremont, Greenwood, have had 173,000 cars by the middle of August. This is 54,000 less than the figure last year. D.L. Hall, Conservation Authority spokesman said that poor summer weather is to blame for the drop. It is not believed that the increase in the entrance fee had any effect.

Mrs. Agnes West, a resident of Brier Bush Hospital, celebrated her 102nd birthday, Aug. 17.

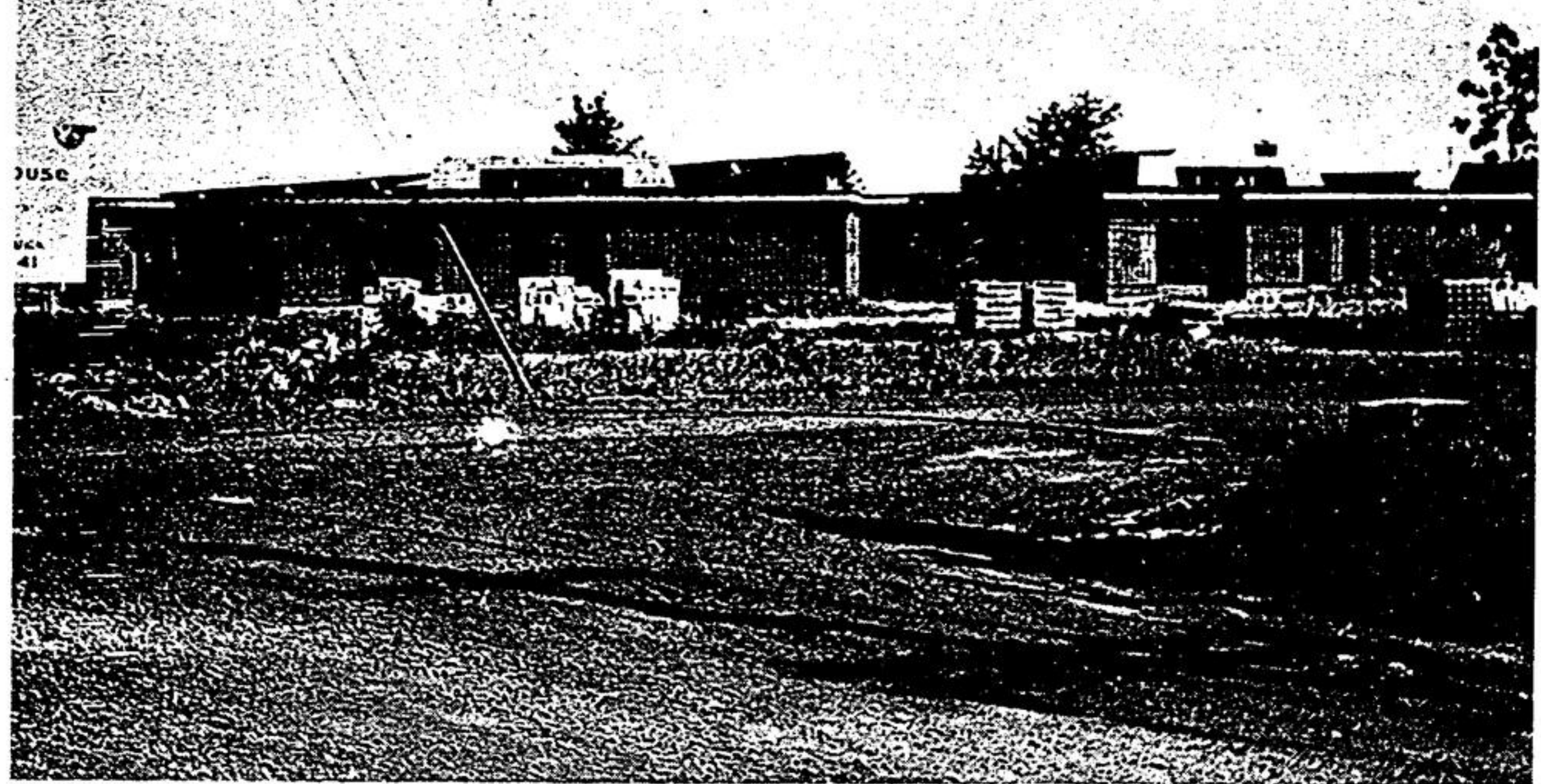
The Hospital management contributed a birthday cake in honor of the occasion, and a reception was held in their dining room.
