No decision yet on schools use

YORK REGION - To clarify the question of community use of schools, the York County Board of Education recently issued a statement.

According to this release, no firm policy has been established. The Board stated, "The matter is under study, as it has been for the past three years." The Board's spokesman attacked the charge of \$11 per hour, which a municipal official recently stated would be the fee for use of schools by community groups.

"There has been no decision to charge either \$11 each hour or \$11 each time a school is used for recreational purposes. The estimated \$100,000 that recreational use of schools cost each year can be provided through charging users: or through the educational tax rate; or through the municipal tax rate." It was also pointed out that, at present, all municipalities contribute the same amount for this purpose; meaning, in effect, that some municipalities are subsidizing others.

"It is not surprising that the municipal councils which have expressed the greatest concern are those where schools have been most heavily used for recreation, and who are now being subsidized in this use by their poorer neighbors," concluded the Board's statement.

The question of community use is expected to appear on the agenda of the next Board meeting, Aug. 28. The next regular meeting of the Whitchurch - Stouffville Recreation Committee is Wednesday, Aug. 30 in the Vandorf Hall at 7:30 p.m.
