Mobile home park pre-mature - Mayor

GORMLEY - A request for a mobile home park, to be established on a 90-acre site, east of Don Mills Road and north of the Stouffville-Gormley Road, was reintroduced at a meeting of Whitchurch-Stouffville Planning Committee, Sept. 1. Mayor Ken Laushway declared that in his opinion, any such development in this area would be premature. "We are only 30 miles from downtown Toronto. In a few years we will be solid with houses, Markham to Stouffville and Richmond Hill to Stouffville. Right now we have the best opportunity to control development and not have it sprouting all over the place. The problem of sideroad development is going to get worse. Our chance can be ruined by such haphazard building". Councillor vanNostrand who gave a verbal report on her findings on visiting a similar site in Innisfil Township, declared that it was her belief that people should have a choice to live in

accommodation. "This choice is not available here", she said. "You've thrown blocks in front of estate development" and cited Ballantrae. "What have you got for these people who want to live in an over 40 neighborhood?" Mrs. vanNostrand told the Committee that the mobile homes she visited were very attractive and on checking with the Clerk of the municipality, found they had not yet received a single police or fire call. She said this should not be called low-cost housing. Fifty percent of the people were retired, many having given up large expensive homes. She did suggest that such a development should not be established next to an existing urban area. Chairman Tom Lonergan agreed that there should be a place

over. "We don't know if these restrictions would hold up", said Mr. Ratcliff. "I'm concerned about the lagoon type of sewer system", said councillor Baker. "We've never had any report on whether it would work in this particular soil". "I couldn't support it unless I knew that it would pay its way".
