Honored at awards' ceremony

But no prize was more deserving than the one provided by the coaches and presented by Town Councillor Tom Lonergan to Mrs. Ruth Warden, the originator of the house league system, back in 1970.

Three years ago, the group included 17 teams, both boys and girls. This year, there were 33, involving an estimated 60 coaches and over 500 players.

Councillor Lonergan referred to the program as "a community affair". He said that the gift (a clock), was by no means to be taken as a hint that Mrs. Warden should, in future, get to the games on time, but only as a token of appreciation for the work she has done.

League champions were declared as follows: Squirt Boys, Preston Lake, The Stouffville Tribune trophy; Squirt Girls, Pine Orchard and Vandorf (tied), Stewart Burnett trophy; Pee-wee Boys, Ballantrae I, Tony Rodgers Memorial trophy; Pee-wee Girls, Stouffville II and Pine Orchard (tied), H. R. Hunt trophy; Bantam Boys, Pine Orchard, the Coaches' Trophy.

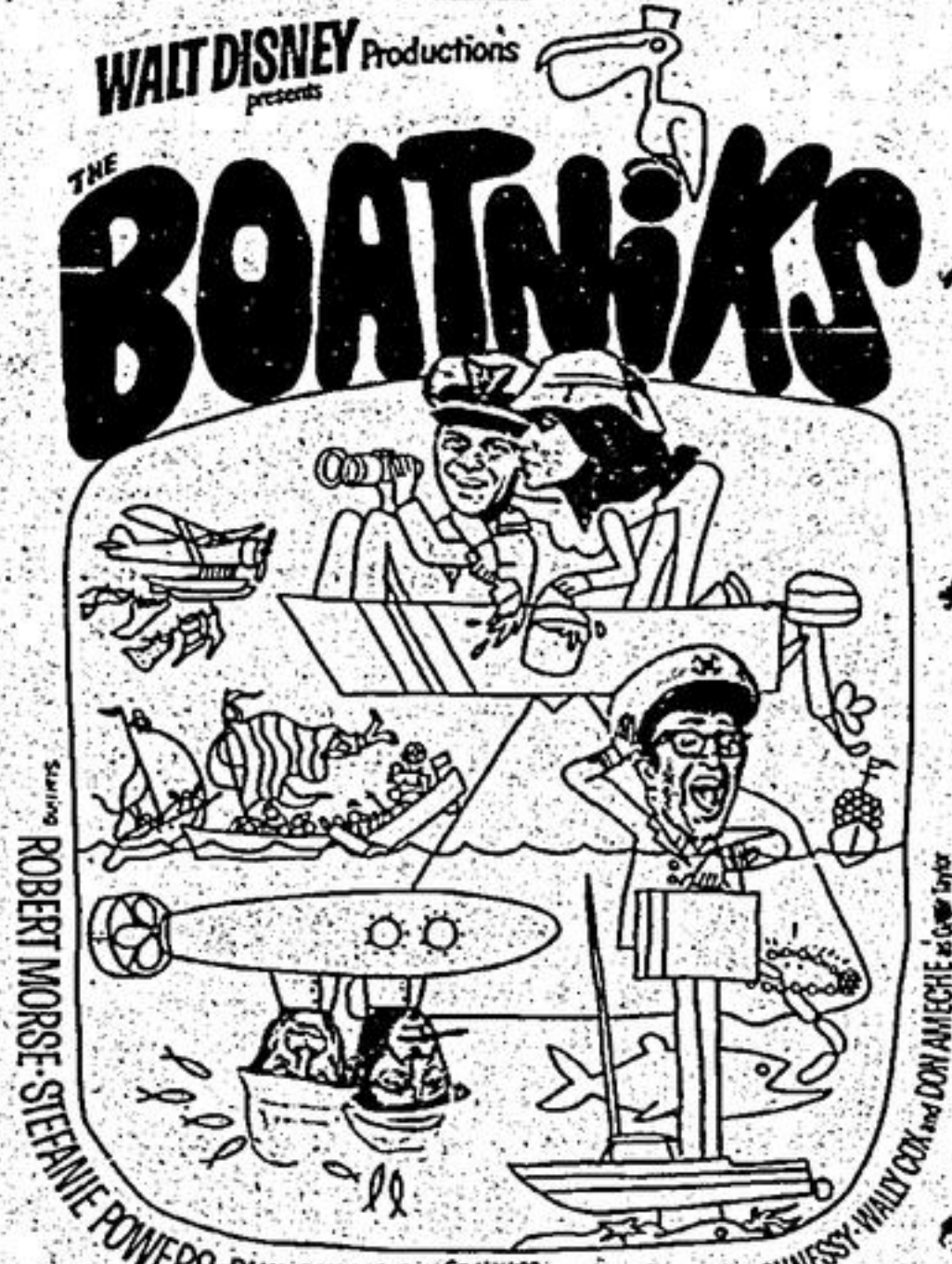
Instruction (adults only), begins Sept. 19 (Tuesdays only), from 9 to 10 p.m. The fee is \$12.
