

# New Democrats - the Liberals of fifty years ago

When Prime Minister Trudeau was in Richmond Hill last month, for a Liberal rally, 11 year old Matthew Gustar was most anxious to meet him. He did - and promptly handed the PM some New Democratic literature.

Matthew is the son of Wally Gustar, NDP candidate for York-Simcoe.

"My son and 8 year old daughter, Deanna, are very aware of my political involvement and 'campaigning', he commented, in an interview with The Tribune. "I came from a large family - 4 boys and 4 girls. My mother and father were Liberals and, after dinner, we'd sit at the dining-room table and discuss politics seriously and emotionally. I try to do that with my children."

His parents and some of the family have switched Party affiliations since the dining-room debates and he, himself, became actively involved in campaign work in 1962 when he "knocked on doors for Val Scott". Mr. Gustar describes the NDP of today as the Liberal party of 50 years ago.

The 32 year old candidate, his wife Jane and children live in Richmond Hill and, although not in York-Simcoe, you could he says, "hit the riding with a rock, from his back yard."

A qualified aircraft maintenance engineer for 15 years, Mr. Gustar is retraining at York University. He is studying History and Political Science and, last year, attained 5 'A' credits at evening extension classes.

## Auto salvage plant rejected by Town

GORMLEY. The benefits of locating an auto salvage plant on a parcel of industrial land, north of Gormley, were dismantled by members of Planning Committee, Oct. 6.

The proposal which had been presented, the previous week, by Sam Kestenberg, Beaver Auto Parts, Toronto, was to establish a large service and storage warehouse with retail sales outlet, on 20 acres near Don Mills Road.

Mr. Kestenberg attempted to convince members that this operation differed in concept from an auto-wreckers, in that only late models with salvageable parts were processed for resale; not old cars for scrap. He stressed that any sections of bodies kept outside would be stored neatly in racks.

Despite assurances that his plant and storage area would not be an eyesore and that it could be adequately fenced, members of the Committee were sceptical.

"We can't consider anything that needs a fence around 20 acres," commented Mayor Ken Laushway.

Other members agreed that the nature of the business could only attract similar "open storage" industries to the area.

Chairman Lonergan, though not opposed to the "auto salvage" concept, did not want it in this location.

"If we keep saying no all the time, we won't have anything there," Mr. Ratcliff added.

"Well," speculated the Mayor, "maybe we'd be better with nothing."

The Committee concluded that "automobile dismantling" was not compatible with the area zoning.

## Sixty-home plan

STOUFFVILLE. A revised plan for a subdivision north of Manitoba Street, received favorable comment at a Planning Committee, Oct. 6.

The plan, submitted by Sidney Sears, realtor, comprises 60 lots, two-thirds of which have under 50 feet frontage.

Chairman, Tom Lonergan, approved the smaller lots which are, predominantly on the west side of an extension of Park Drive North, and stressed that he hoped two-bedroom homes could be built on them to meet the needs of elderly, retired citizens who wish to settle in town.

Although Mr. Sears warned against "ghettoizing" small homes, he concurred that they should be "spotted around" the subdivision.

The Planning Committee agreed the development looked very attractive in print, and accepted the plan for further examination.
