He was the winner of the Guaranty Trust Co., Award for the best plowed land by a North York Branch resident; a \$5 prize, donated by Win Timbers, for the Best Finish in tractor class and the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce Trophy for the best plowed land in stubble by a resident in North York.

Other 'specials', Saturday, went to Barry Timbers, best crown in a tractor class; Sam Testa, Bank of Nova Scotia Award; Greg Timbers, Stouffville Credit Union Trophy; Lloyd Grove, Esso Champion Special; Michael Grove, T. Credit Union assets up 57% over 1971

STOUFFVILLE - In their annual report, the Stouffville District Credit Union Ltd., showed that the year ending July 31, 1972 was indeed exceptional, with assets up 57 percent over 1971. Applications for membership were also up by 50 to 60 per month, to 2,225. The increase in loans outstanding stood at close to two million dollars - up by half a million over the previous period. Commenting on the way the area has changed, the report notes that the backbone in the early years were the farmers and their families.
