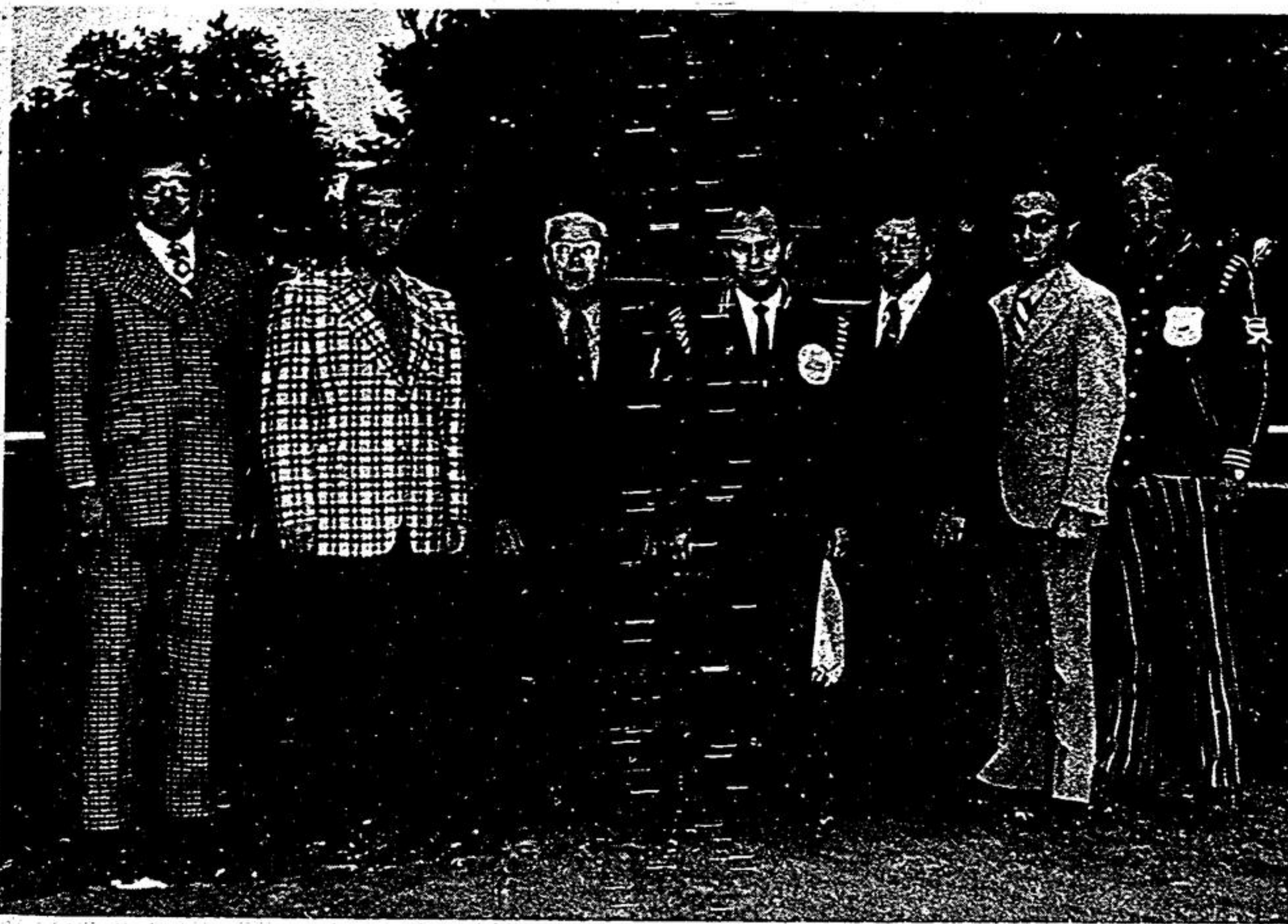

Airport stand 'a bid for votes' - Ward

ONT. RIDING candidate for Ontario Riding, commenting on the recent Pickering airport
