# Federal-Provincial Study Historic Pickering buildings

**PICKERING TWP.** A Federal-Provincial sponsored study to identify historic buildings in Pickering Township, will be carried out by the Canadian Inventory of Historic Buildings.

The CIHB, an agency of the federal Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, will identify buildings of historical significance on the site of the Pickering Airport proposed by the Federal Ministry of Transport and in the new North Pickering community development being undertaken by the Government of Ontario.

The Federal and Provincial governments will share the cost of the project.

The CIHB, formed a year ago, has just completed a study in the Port Hope area, and will move into the Pickering area this fall.

In an effort to identify buildings of genuine historical value the CIHB will consider buildings constructed before 1914.

The new study is part of a continuing effort by the two levels of government to preserve the history of the area to be occupied by the proposed new airport and the North Pickering community. This summer the oral history and legend of

the area was recorded on tape in a Federal-Provincial program. The CIHB study will be carried out under the direction of the Joint Environmental Co-ordinating Committee established by the two levels of Government.
