**Clothing sale exceeds \$600**

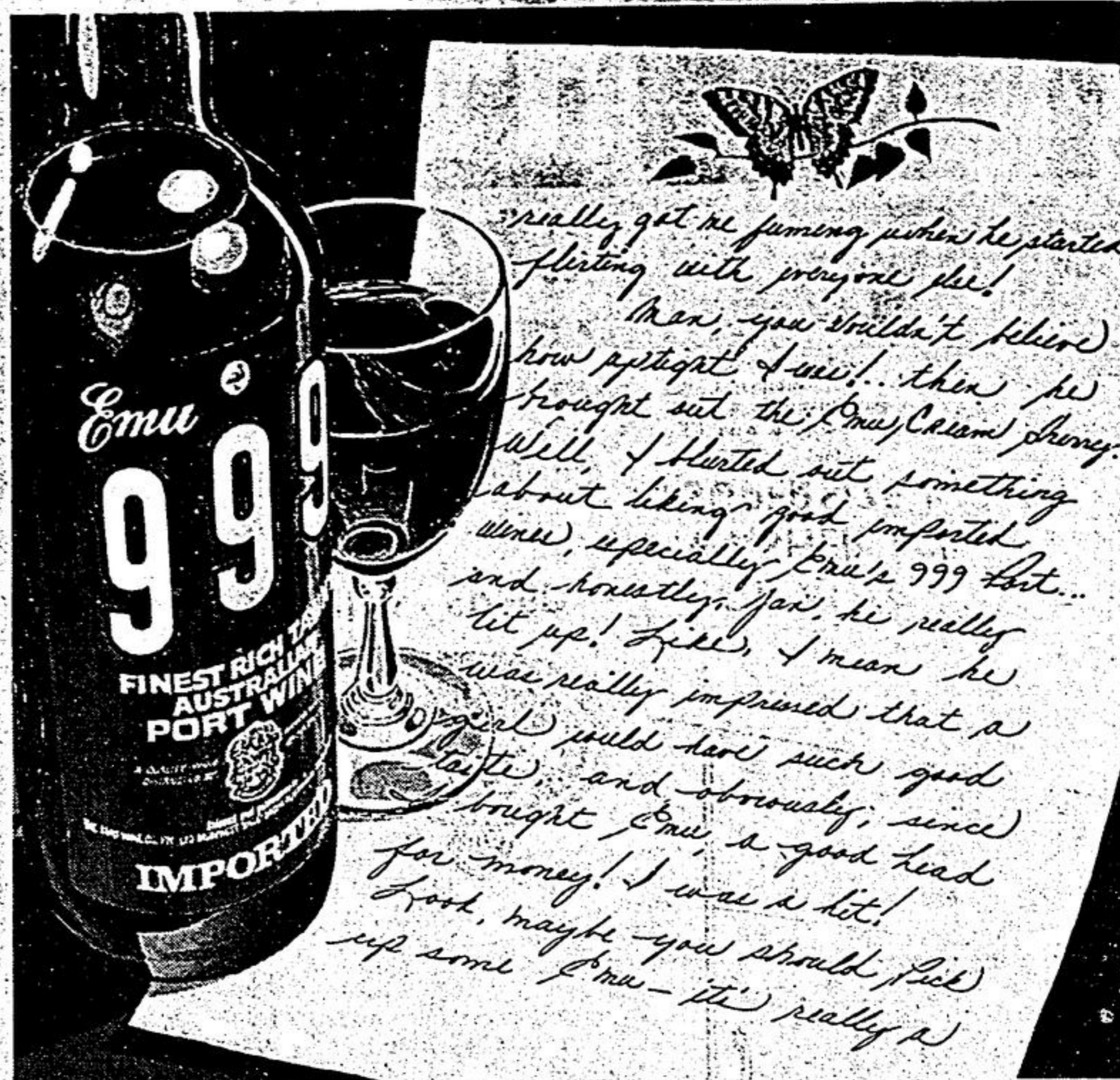
